Berne, June 9.

THE Deputies who went from hence fometime ago to St. Gall, to enquire into feveral Diforders that had been committed in that Convent, and whereof Complaints had been made to this State, returned hither on the 4th Instant, and are to make their Report the 12th to the Sovereign Council. On the 4th two Deputies were chosen by this Canton, to go and affift at the General Dyet, which, according to Cuftom, meets every Midfummer; and, 'tis faid, is to affemble this Year at Baden, their ancient meeting Place. A Deputy is likewife ap pointed on the part of this State, to go to Soleurre, and receive of the French Ambaffa-dour one Year's Arrear of Penfion, which he is paying to each Canton. Letters from Mi lan advile, that Sig. Molines arrived there from Rome the 25th paft. The Prince of Lewenstein, Governour of the Milaneze, having Notice of his Arrival, detached immediately two German Officers at the Head of a Company to his Inn, called the Three Kings, to feize him, and from thence he was carried in a Coa h to the Caffle, together with his R t ue c nfifting of fix Clergy-men, two G ntlemen, and two Servants. They are kept th re close Priloners, and no body is admitted to speak to them. All his Baggage was likewife carried to the Caffle, where the Portmantles having been open'd and thoroughly fearched, were afterwards returned to him. He having asked Leave to fend a Courier to Rome, it was granted him; and the Prince of Lewenftein dispatched likewise one to Vienna. The true Reason of the Imprisonment of that Minister, who was on his Way from Rome to Madrid, in order to act as Inquifitor General of that Kingdom, is not yet known. Yefterday being the Birth-Day of the King of Great Britain, Mr. Manning, His Majefty's Refident here, gave a handsome Entertain-ment to many People of Distinction of this

Place, which was followed by a Ball. Vienna, June 2. The laft Letters from Peterwaradin fay, that they could yet learn nothing of the Motions or Defigns of the Turks, tho' they had ufed their utmoft Endeavours to get Intelligence; and that great Numbers of Arnauts deferted every Day from Belgrade for fear of a Siege? That on the 23d paft, Prince Eugene came to Peterwaradin, and the next Day went from thence to Denta, to review Count Mercy's Army which now confifts of 40000 Men. That on the 25th he held a Council of War of all the General Officers, to confider of the Operations of the Campaign, in which it is faid it was refolved to paft the Danube at Orfova, and that Count Mercy fhould endeavour to feize on that Pafs. We hear by the Way of Walachia, that the Differences between the Turks and Tartars encreafe daily, infomuch that the latter will fend but 30000 Men into the Field this Year, which is not above half the Number of what they used to furnish. This Disappointment is the greater, because we are certainly nform'd that the Afiatick Troops march very flowly and unwillingly. Three Days ago Count Gallas set out from hence for Rome to continue his Embassy there, and this Morning the Count de Charolois and Count de Bonneval went towards the Army in Hungary, in company with a Son of the Duke de Villeroy, who arrived here two Days ago.

Vienna, June 5. Since the 2d Inftant there are no Letters come from Prince Eugene, nor do we hear from other Hands that his Army has made any Motion; neither have we got any further Account of the Turks, but from a Rafcian, whom the Prince fent over the Save for a Spy, and was forced to fwim back again to fave his Life, who reports that the Bulk of the Turkifh Army is full at Adrianople waiting for the Troops from Afia, and only 30000 Janifaries are on the March towards Belgrade; fo that there is Reafon to hope from the Backwardnefs of the Enemy's Preparations; that it will not be fo difficult for the Imperial Army to crofs the River as was apppehended, provided they do not delay the attempting it much longer. The Troops of Bavaria which were faid to be imbarked fome Days ago, will not be ready to leave their Quarters till the 10th Inftant.

Caffel, June 10. On the Third Inftant Prince William arrived from Dreiden, and the Day after his Brother Prince George, from Berlin, who fet out laft Night Poft for Vienna, in his Way to Hungary where he is to ferve this Icar as a Volunteer. The Difpute about the Marches between the Landgrave and Count Waldeck, which has been depending for fome Time before the Judges of the Empire, was determined laft Week in Favour of the latter \hat{y} and it is expected, that the Emperour will give Commifion to fome of the neighbouring Princes to execute the Sentence of the Court, and put that Count in Poffeffion of a Village, which the Landgrave had feized upon. Letters from Donawerth advifes, that the Heffian Regiment defigned for Hungary, embarked there the 7th Inftant. Laft Week M. Brunel arrived from Sweden, by the Way of Gottenburg; he is to refide here, as the King of Sweden's Secretary, to affift the Swedifh Envoy General Sparr.

Copenhagen, June 12. On the 10th Inflant arrived in the Sound three British Men of War from England, having under their Convoy thirty Merchant-Ships bound for the Baltick. Another British Man of War, being one of those which cruise in the North-Sea, came into this Port on the 8th, with five Swedish Prizes, three of them Privateers, the other two Merchant-Men. On the 11th the British and Danish Squadrons failed from the Bay of King for the Island of Hanoe.

Hague, June 18. On the 13th Inftant the French Ambaffadour the Marquels of Chateauncuf received a Letter from Count la Marcq,

marcq, dates the 22d or last month from Lund in Schonen, where he arrived on the 18th; which the faid Ambaffadour has communicated to the States General and to Mr. Whitworth His Britannick Majeity's Minister, and on the 15th the latter had a Conference with their High Mightineffes Deputies. We have Advice, that the Czar was to fet out from Paris on the 14th, and defigned to drink the Waters at Spa, where he is to be on the 22d or 25th at furtheft : Letters from Bonne of the 11th Instant, say his Czarish Majesty had fent a Gentleman to the Elector of Cologne, to defire free Paffage for 300 Branden burgh Horfe, who are to ferve him as a Guard during his Stay there. The Provinces of Gelderland, Holland Utrecht, and Friseland, have confented to the Project of Accommodation with the Elector of Cologne: The Deputies of Groninghen have Orders to agree with the reft; and as the States of Zealand and Over-Ystel are now astembled, it is not queftioned but they will also declare themselves in Conformity to the others in a few Days.
