Madrid, July 5. On the 30th past the Royal Family came to the Pardo. The Intendant Patinno followed the Court thither from the Escorial, and having had several Conferences with the Ministers, was to set out Yesterday or to Day, in all Haste, for Barcelona. The Marquess de Leide having been sent for from Saragossa to Court, and having had certain Instructions given him, is likewise on his Departure for Barcelona, whither some Regiments are ordered, which 'tis believed are to imbarck on board the Squadron that is expected there from Cadiz, and which is to be reinforced by five Men of War that have been fitted out in the Mediterranean. The said Squadron from Cadiz passed by Malaga on the 25th of last Month. The Pope's Nuncio, Sig. Aldobrandi, has notified his Arrival here to the foreign Ministers. The Councils of Castile, the Indies, the Hazienda or Treasury, and the Orders, removed last Week into the Duke d' Uzeda's Palace, where those Offices are to be kept for the future; as are also those of the Secretaries of State and of War, which are removing thither; the Increase of the King's Family and Household rendering it necessary for them to have all the Royal Palace to themselves.

Copenhagen, July 10. Last Night the King of Denmark, with the Prince Royal, set out from hence for Jutland, whence they will proceed to Holstein, and 'tis believed his Majesty designs to have an Interview afterwards with the King of Prussia, and with the Czar. The Fleet of Merchant-Ships which arrived last Week from England, sailed into the Baltick on the 8th Instant. Yesterday Sir George Byng received Advice, by an Express from Dantzick, that the Dragon and the Dartmouth, two of the British Men of War which are cruising between that Place and the Isle of Gothland, have taken a Swedish Man of War carrying 36 Guns and 283 Men, and a Privateer of 8 Guns and 35 Men. The Difference which has been for some Time between this Court and that of Mecklenbourg, about the Passage of the Danish Couriers through the Town of Rostock, is at length

accommodated; and the Conveyance of Letters by Post through those Parts, is settled on the same Foot as it was when the Swedes were possessor of Pomerania.

Dunkirk, July 18. On the 16th arrived here the Commissioners appointed by the King of Great Britain, to see the Sluyce and other Works of the new Harbour of Mardyke intirely demolished, pursuant to the Treaty of Alliance between the Crowns of Great Britain and France and the States General. Those Commissioners immediately proceeded to Mardyke, where 400 Men are actually at Work in making two Dams or Bardeaux, the one above the other below the Sluyce, in order to pump out the Water between both, to take up the Radies, Bajoyes, &c. and the Floodgates are already unhinged, and most of them taken away.

This Day M. Wesselowsky, Resident from the *Czar* of Muscovy, had a private Audience of His Majesty, at which he delivered his Credential Letters; he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Sunderland, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies. He was afterwards conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies to private Audiences of their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales in their respective Apartments.
