Madrid, July 5. On the 30th past the Royal Family came to the Pardo. The Intendant Patinno followed the Court thither from the Escurial, and having had reveral Conferences with the Ministers, was to set out Yester-day or to Day, in all Haste, for Barce-lona. The Marquess de Leide having been fent for from Saragoffa to Court, and ha-ving had certain inftructions given him, is likewife on his Departure for Barcelona, whither fome Regiments are ordered, which tis believed are to imbark on board the Squadron that is expected there from Cadiz, and which is to be reinforced by five Men of War that have been fitted out in the Mediterranean. The faid Squadron from Cadiz paffed by Malaga on the 25th of laft Month. The Pope's Nuncio, Sig. Aldobrandi, has notified his Arrival here to the foreign Ministers. The Councils of Castile, the Indies, the Hazienda or Treasury, and the Or-ders, removed last Week into the Duke d' Uzeda's Palace, where those Offices are to be kept for the future ; as are also those of the Secretaries of State and of War, which are removing thither; the Increase of the King's Family and Household rendring it neceffary for them to have all the Royal Palace to themselves.

Copenhagen, July 10. Last Night the King of Denmark, with the Prince Royal, fet out from hence for Jutland, whence they will proceed to Holftein, and 'tis believed his Majefty defigns to have an Interview afterwards with the King of Prufia, and with the Czar. The Fleet of Merchant-Ships which arrived last Week from England, failed into the Bal-, tick on the 8th Instant. Testerday Sir George Byng received Advice, by an Expreis from Dantzick, that the Dragon and the Dartmonth, two of the British Men of War which are cruifing between that Place and the Isle of Gothland, have taken a Swedish Man of War carrying 36 Guns and 283 Men, and a Pri-vateer of 8 Guns and 35 Men. The Dif-ference which has been for fome Time between this Court and that of Mecklenbourg, about the Paffage of the Danish Couriers through the Town of Rostock, is at length
