of Holftein Ploen, concerning the Counties of Oldenburgh and Delmenhorst, to which they equally pretend.

Haghe, March, 24. The States General observing the Velt Marshal Wurts, to have been of late fomewhat diffatisfied with his employment in their Service, so far as to be about to quit it, have refolved to encrease his yearly Entertainment with 8000 Florins more, and have accordingly written to the feveral Provinces for their confents in that matter. The Equipage of the Fleet, to be fet out this Summer advances apace, most of the Ships at Amsterdam and Rotterdam being already fitted and in a condition in a very fhort time to put to Sea, though the Squadrons of Zealand, Friezland, Ge are not fo forward.

Bruffels March, 17. Some days fince his Excellency went privately hence under pretence of going a hunting, but indeed with intent to furprize by his unexpected arrival, the Garrifon at Naumur, where not finding their Companies compleat according to the Muster Rolls, he caused several of the Officers to be implifoned till further Order. We are here lately informed, that the French are going to build a Fort upon the River Meuse, a little above Charlemont; but this we are willing to believe is onely fome falle report. His Excellency hath sent di-rections to the several Maisfires de Camp in the Army, to take on what men they can, and that they immediately fend them up to Bruffels, to be there Regifred in the Kings Books.

Dittoj21. The 18th infant our Governor the Count de Monterey went hence for Gaunt, intending to pais from thence to Bruges, Oftend, Nemport and Iprea to

visit those Garrifons, and see all things put into a good posture there, and to morrow his Excellency is expected here again. The Marquis de Varennes lately. sent hither by his most Christian Majesty in quality of Envoye, having performed his creand here, depart-ed again the 18th instant, in order to his return to that King at S. Germaine ; it is faid the chief occasion of his coming was to acquaint his Excellency with his most Christian Majesties intentions of spending sometime in Flanders this Summer, and to defire passage for the French Troops which are to march towards Ath; as likewife that the Subjects of his Catholick Majesty in these Provinces, may be allowed to work for money at the Fortifications which are at prefent making at the faid place of Ath.

Florence, March I. We are here informed of a very strange and unfortunate accident, lately happened on the person of the Marquis de Fosnidono, afree Prince in our neighborhood, of the name of Malespina, of which is the Prince of Maffu and Carrara, who fome days fince upon a mifunderitanding that had formerly paffed between him and his Brother, was affaulted by him in the night time, accompanyed with one or two more, whom he had hired to that purpole; and after some resistance, barbarously murdered by them; in which rencounter, a fervant of the faid Marquis, striving in what he could to defend his Master, shot his Brother with a pistol in the head, of which he likewite immediately died ; the reft that were parties in that action, by the favour of the night made their escape ; which hath much afflitted all people here, who not onely lament the lofs of the faid Marquis, a person of much worth and honour, but that fo noble and confiderable a Family, which at present confisted onely of these two Brothers, should be extinct in so deplorable a manner.

Paris, March 20. From Brest we have advice, that the 11th instant arrived in that Port, five men of war of the Count d Estrees squadron, who in August last went thence for the Canaries, and Cape de Verd Islands; fix Marine Companies that had ferved on board the faid thips, are ordered to march towards Amiens, the place of Rendequous for his Majesties Troops. They further adde, that there were fitting out the Royal Sun, the Royal Duke, together with feveral other great men of war, the first being mounted with 120 Guns, the fecond with 106, and the reft of fixty and upwards. The 18th inftant François de Harlay de Chanvalon, our Archbishop, having re-ceived his confirmatory Bulls from Rome, took possession of his See accordingly, with all imaginable pomp and folemnity, the Chapter of Noftre Dame having sent their Deputies to conduct him to that Cathedral Church, where being placed upon a large Throne, erected for that purpole, the usual Ceromonies of his Investitiure were performed in the prefence of feveral perfons of great Quality, who were afterwards entertained at a very splendid and magnificent dinner by the faid Archbishop at his own Palace. All things are here making ready for his Majesties journey into Flanders.
