##### RELOCATION OF A MOTOR CYCLE BAY IN WHITEFRIARS STREET

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of London, on 21st January 2000, made an Order, under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to further amend the City of London (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Special Parking Area) Order 1994 so that a motor cycle bay in Whitefriars Street will be relocated.

##### STOPPING-UP OF HIGHWAYS

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order, under section 247 of the above Act, to authorise the stopping-up of an area of all-purpose highway on land off George Edwards Road, Fakenham, Norfolk.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted to C & C Designs Limited by North Norfolk District Council on 4th June 1998, under Ref. 01980332PM, and planning permission granted to and by North Norfolk District Council on 8th September 1998, under Ref. 01980257PF.

The proposed Order will require the improvement of all purpose highway at George Edwards Road and the provision of a new all purpose highway maintainable at the public expense for which Norfolk County Council will be the local highway authority.

The proposed Order will provide that the stopping-up must not be carried out until the developer has provided the new highway and that highway shall be a highway maintainable at the public expense for which Norfolk County Council will be the local highway authority.
