HIS Court has received Advice from Sardinia of the 3d Instant, by a Courier from Naples, importing, that on the 26th, 27th and 28th past, the Spaniards bombarded Cagliari from the Sea; that on the 29th they landed four Pieces of Cannon and five Mortars, with which they continued firing on the Town to the 3d Inftant; but without having done much Damage, or begun any formal Attack: That their Land-Forces were not above 5000 Men compleat; and that the Viceroy, the Marquess de Rubi, was determined to make a good Defence. two Princes of Bavaria arrived here from the Army two Days ago, and will flay here (as is given out) about The Electoral Prince of a Fortnight. Saxony is expected here from Lintz. The last Letters from the Imperial Army encamped at Semlin, relate, that five Turks arrived unexpectedly there, without any Passport or Guard, and delivered a Letter to Prince Eugene; upon which is was immediately reported in the Camp, that they naw bright Proposals of Peace; but the Letter was only to desire that the Hostages which the Turks lest in Belgrade for the Performance of the Capitulation, might be fet at Liberty, which was immediately ordered, and they accordingly went away with those Turks, without any mention of Peace on either Side. Eugene came back from Semendria on the 8th, and having passed by Panzova, gave Orders for its being fortified, which they are accordingly going to do out of Hand. The Troops which convoyed that Part of the Garrison of Belgrade that went by Land as far as Nissa, are returned to the Camp, and report, that the Grand Vizier had been deposed, and a Son of the old Bashaw of Bosnia put in his Place. Some Regiments which were fent after the Tartars in Upper Hungary, have received Orders to march into Transylvania, that they may be ready to join General Steinville in case of Need, all the Tartars who were in the Turkish Army being gone to Walachia. Last Night Sir Robert Sutton arrived here from Paris.

Hague, Oct. 1. On the 29th past the Deputies of the States General had a Conference with the British Ministers the Lord Cadogan and Mr. Whitworth, to communicate to them the Memorials which had been given in by the Spanish Ambassadour the Marquess Beretti-Landi, to justify the Expedition against Sardinia. The Deputies assured them, that as the good Offices of their High Mightinesses had been defired for composing the present Troubles, they were ready to joyn with His Britannick Majesty in his Endeavours for preserving the Tranquility of These Memorials have likewise been communicated by the States to the Marquess de Chateauneuf the French Anrbaffadour, and to the Imperial Minister Baron Heems. The States General have thought fit to write a Letter to the Czar, in favour of the Town of Dantzick, at the earnest Request of the Magistrates of that City, and in Confideration of the great Interest they have in the Trade thither.
