## THE A556 TRUNK ROAD (M6 MOTORWAY, JUNCTION 19) (60 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

If made as proposed the Order will impose a 60 miles per hour speed limit on the A556 trunk road (Chester Road), Lostock Gralam in the county of Cheshire, from a point adjacent to Holly Tree Farm, 215 metres south of the junction with Tabley Hill Lane to a point at the end of the dual carriageway section, 225 metres north of the junction with Moss Lane, a total distance of 1,170 metres.
