(f) the pursuance of any statutory duty of the Post Office for the purpose of collecting or delivering letters provided the vehicle bears the Royal Mail livery;

(g) any vehicle which enters the bus lane to enable a person to get on or off the vehicle;

(h) any vehicle crossing a bus lane to get to or from any road or vehicular accessway to premises adjacent the bus lane;

(i) any vehicle entering or proceeding in the bus lane in order to avoid an accident or to give help in an accident or emergency or otherwise to take action for public's safety.

The general effect of the "Restriction of Stopping on Bus Stops" Order will be to amend the Brent (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (No. 1) 1974 and (Restriction of Stopping on Bus Stops) (No. 3) 1999 Traffic Orders so that:

(A) the existing Bus Stop Clearway Restrictions in the lengths of street specified in Schedule 3 to this notice will be revoked;

(B) prohibit all vehicles from stopping:

(i) "at any time" in the bus stops which lie within the lengths of street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice;

(ii) between 7 a.m. and midnight throughout the week in the bus stops which lie within the length of street specified in Schedule 5 to this notice. (iii) between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. throughout the week in the bus stops which lie within the length of street specified in Schedule 6 to this notice. The prohibition will not apply to:

(a) a bus whilst picking up or setting down passengers;

(g) a person in control of a vehicle who is required by law to stop or is prevented from proceeding in circumstances beyond the drivers control. The prohibitions referred to in sub-paragraphs 2 and 3(B) above will not apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

The general effect of the "Waiting and Loading Restrictions" (Amendment) Order will be further to amend Brent (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1979, so that in the lengths of street specified in Schedule 7 to this notice the hours during which the existing prohibition applies on waiting by vehicles (including waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) will be changed so that such prohibition will apply between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.

The general effect of the "Goods Vehicles Free Loading Places" Order will be to:

(a) designate free loading places in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 8 to this notice to operate between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (loading/unloading limited to 30 minutes, no return for two hours);

(i) each parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of the Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles or invalid carriages displaying a valid parking ticket;

(ii) the maximum initial period for which a vehicle, displaying a valid parking ticket may be left during the permitted hours in the parking places will be 2 hours;

(iii) the charge for short term parking in the parking places will be 20 pence for 20 minutes, 40 pence for 40 minutes, £1 for 60 minutes and £2 for 120 minutes, the tickets for which will be issued to pay and display meters:

(e) vehicles displaying Orange badges are able to park in specified designated areas for an unlimited period;

(f) additional residents' parking spaces and amendments to metered
