Hambourg, Oct. 26. We have Advice, that an Express from Copenhagen is arrived at Gluckstadt, with an Order from the King of Denmark to let all Shipping pass on the Elbe without Molestation.

Brussels, Oct. 25. The Marquess de Prié is gone from Ghent, to take a View of Bruges, Ostend and Newport; and is expected back here the Middle of next Week: His Eldest Son, the Marquess de Poncalier, is returned hither. The States of Brabant assembled here on the 22d Instant, and took into Deliberation the Subsidies demanded of them for the current Year, but separated without coming to any Conclusion.

Whitehall, Oct. 22. Sunday last being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Coronation, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at Hampton-Court; and that Evening and the following there were Illuminations and other publick Demonstrations of Joy, throughout London and Westminster.
