ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A47 TRUNK ROAD (UPPINGHAM ROAD, HOUGHTON ON THE HILL) (40 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2000

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A47 Trunk Road at Houghton on the Hill, in the County of Leicestershire.

The effect of the Order would be to impose a 40 miles per hour speed limit on the A47:

(a) from a point 149 metres south-east of its junction with Deane Gate Drive to a point 53 metres north-west of that junction; and

(b) from a point 187 metres east of its junction with Firs Road to a point 288 metres east of that junction.

A copy of the draft Order, together with plans illustrating the proposals and a statement of the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected during opening hours at County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester LE3 8RJ, Harborough District Council, Council Offices, Adam & Eve Street, Market Harborough or may be seen at or obtained by application to the Highways Agency, Project Services Secretariat, Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL, during normal office hours.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 THE A46 TRUNK ROAD (FOSSE WAY, NOTTINGHAMSHIRE) (DERESTRICTION) ORDER 200

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order under sections 82(2) and 83(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A46 Trunk Road in Nottinghamshire.

Average amount of Bank of England

The effect of the Order would be to impose a 60 miles per hour speed limit on the A46 at Flintham from a point 47 metres north of its junction with the centre line of the Ministry of Defence entrance to a point 287 metres north of that junction.

This section of the A46 was subject to a 60 miles per hour speed limit but, with the installation of street lighting, the speed limit automatically reduced to 30 miles per hour. The Order will return the speed limit to 60 mph.
