A P R O C L A M A T I O N.

WHereas we have received Information, that on Tuesday the 22d of this Instant October, between the Hours of 10 and 11 at Night, a tall Man with long lank Hair, in a short light coloured Coat, did in Stafford-Street in the City of Dublin, in a most barbarous and inhumane Manner, murder and assassinate Colonel Henry Lutterell, as he was going in a Hackney Chair from a Coffee-House on Cork-Hill, to his own House in Stafford-Street aforesaid, by firing a Pistol or Gun loaded with Ball, into the said Chair, and thereby so dangerously wounding the said Henry Lutterell, that he is since dead of his said Wounds; and that the said Assassin found Means to make his Escape, and the Authors and Contrivers of such an horrid Murder are still undiscovered.

And whereas we have likewise been informed, that on Thursday the 5th of September last, the House of Charles O'Hara, Esq; at Kinsale in the County of Dublin, was in the Night time broke open by a Person now in Goal, with intent to assassinate and murder the said Charles O'Hara; but that no Discovery hath yet been made of the Authors and Contrivers of the said villainous Attempt.

We the Lord Lieutenant and Council, having a just Abhorrence of all such barbarous and horrid Practices, and thinking it absolutely necessary that all due Encouragement should be given for the Discovery and Apprehension of the said Assassin, and the Authors and Contrivers of the Murder of the said Colonel Henry Lutterell, do by this our Proclamation, publish and declare, that we will give the necessary Orders for Payment of the Sum of 300 l. to such Person or Persons as shall discover, take, and apprehend the Person who fired the said Pistol or Gun, or any of the Authors or Contrivers of the said horrid Murder, so as he, they, or any of them, may be convicted thereof; and in Case any of the Persons concerned therein (other than and except the Person who fired the said Pistol or Gun) shall make a full Discovery of his Accomplices, so as one or more of them may be apprehended, and thereof convicted, such Discoverer shall, besides the said Reward, have and receive his Majesty's most gracious Pardon for the same.

And for the more effectual Discovery and Apprehension of the Authors and Contrivers of the said villainous Attempt upon the said Charles O'Hara; we do also hereby further publish and declare, that we will give the like necessary Orders for Payment of the Sum of 100 l. to such Person or Persons who shall discover, take, and apprehend all or any of the Authors or Contrivers of the said barbarous Fact, (other than and except the Person now in Goal for the said Fact) so as they, or any of them, may be convicted thereof: And in Case any of the Persons concerned therein (other than and except the Person now in Goal) shall make a full Discovery of his Accomplices, so as one or more of them may be apprehended and thereof convicted, such Discoverer shall, besides the said Reward, have and receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon for the same.

God Save the KING

Vienna, Oct. 27. The Aga who lately brought to Prince Eugene Proposals of Peace from the Turks, was sent back to the Ottoman Court, (which is said to be now at Adrianople,) with His Imperial Majesty's Answer; and upon the Return of that Aga to Belgrade, where he is daily expected, 'tis believed the Negotiation will forthwith be set on foot. We have Advice from Sardinia, that Cagliari surrendered to the Spaniards on the second Instant; but that the Marquess de Rubi had before made his Escape in the Night, that he might not be forced to capitulate for the whole Island. That Marquess writes, that there are two Places still of some Strength in the North-West Part of the Island, called Alguero and Castel-Aragonese, which he proposes to defend all the Winter, if he can be supported in Time by Reinforcements from Naples or Genoa.

Dresden, Nov. 3. On the 26th of last Month the Queen arrived here from Torgaw, and on the Sunday following assisted at the Celebration of the Jubilee for the Establishment of the Reformation in this Country; on which Occasion her Majesty received the Communion publicly in the Royal Chapel in the Castle. A Declaration is printing, in order to be published throughout this Electorate, by which his Majesty signifies to all his Subjects, that as they have enjoyed intire Liberty of Conscience in his Dominions since the Time he changed his Religion, so his Majesty will for the future maintain them in the Enjoyment of the same Liberty, without suffering the least Alteration to be introduced on Occasion of his Son the Prince's late Change of Religion. Some Days ago Major Habersack and Captain Schutz were shot to Death, having been condemned by a Court-Martial, for not doing their Duty in some Actions against the Polish Confederates, and especially when the latter surprized Posen, in which was a Garrison of the King's, commanded by Major General Seidlitz, who is sentenced to pay a very great Fine, and to lye six Years in Prison: Major Doverschutz was also condemned to be shot, but was pardoned by his Majesty: Four other Officers who did not appear to take their Trials, were hanged in Effigie.

Hague, Nov. 9. On the 7th Instant the Lord Cadogan embarked on board the William and Mary Yacht at the Brill, and put to Sea the same Evening. On the 2d Instant M. Van Stucken presented to the States General a Letter from the King of Denmark, to acquaint them with his Reasons for stopping several North-Holland Ships in the Sound, on Account of the Arrears which are due to him since the last War. M. Geersdorff, the Polish Envoy, has presented to their High Mightinesses a Letter from the King his Master, to notify, that his Son, the Electoral Prince of Saxony, had embraced the Roman Catholick Religion; but that it should make no Alteration, neither in regard to his own Country, nor to his Measures with other foreign Powers.
