THE A36 TRUNK ROAD (BATHAMPTON LANE JUNCTION)— PROHIBITION OF VARIOUS TRAFFIC MOVEMENTS

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order, under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A36 Trunk Road at Bathampton in Bath.

The effect of the Order would be to prohibit:

(a) traffic travelling westwards on the A36, Warminster Road from turning right into Bathampton Lane;

(b) traffic joining the A36 from Bathampton Lane from turning left.

A copy of the Order, of plans illustrating the proposal and the alternative route (via Down Lane) and a statement explaining why the Secretary of State proposes to make the Order may be inspected during office hours at Bath Central Library, The Podium, Bath and Bathampton Post Office.

London Borough of Lambeth PROPOSED CHANGES TO PRIORITY (RED) ROUTE MEASURES IN SUNNYHILL ROAD

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth propose to make the A23 Trunk Road (Lambeth) Red Route (Side Roads) (Amendment No. 1) Traffic Order 2000, under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

In brief, the general nature and effect of the Order would be to prohibit stopping by vehicles at any time on the north-east side of Sunnyhill Road, from a point 21 metres south-east of the western (front) wall of No. 89 Streatham High Road south-eastward for a distance of 10 metres. The existing prohibition on stopping by vehicles which currently applies between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., on Mondays to Saturdays in this length of Sunnyhill Road would be revoked.

The prohibition is necessary to prevent obstructive parking which is taking place across an accessway at night and on Sundays.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER
