THE Baron de la Tour, Chief Minister to the Abbot of St Gall, in Answer to the Letter this Canton wrote lately to him concerning an Accommodation between the two Cantons of Zurich and Berne and that Abbot, has acquainted this State, that his Master is sincerely disposed to Peace; and as a Proof of it desires, that some Persons may meet together on both Sides, without Character, to examine his Pretensions, and discuss in a Conference such Points as have hitherto obstructed a Pacification, leaving the Time and Place of such a Conference to the two Cantons to determine. This Matter will be taken into Consideration at the first Meeting of the Sovereign Council of Two Hundred, which will be held in a few Days.

Leghorne, Oct. 29. Last Week an armed Vessel of Catalonia took a Neapolitan Bark laden with Corn, and carried her into Porto-Longone: But the Spanish Governour there having no Orders to allow of any Hostilities against the Shipping of the Kingdom of Naples, the said Bark was released, and arrived here Yesterday.

Genoa, Nov. 2. On the 26th of last Month arrived a Courier in 10 Days from Madrid, with Dispatches which he delivered to the Spanish Consul residing here, to be dispatched to the Marquess de Lede. The same Evening a Spanish Man of War which had lain some Days in our Port, sailed with those Dispatches for Sardinia, having also on board 20000 Crowns in Specie, which had been remitted hither from Spain for the Use

of his Catholick Majesty's Troops on that Island. On the 28th Mr. Davenant, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy, set out from hence for Milan, whence he is to proceed to Parma, and thence to Florence, and is expected back here in about six Weeks Time. On the 29th arrived here the Duke of Gordon, and Collonel Carpenter; who both embarked Yesterday Morning on a Felucca bound to Leghorne. On the 30th came in a Felucca dispatched from Calvi by the Marquess de Malaspina, who commands the Imperial Regiment of Hamilton which went from hence to assist the Marquess de Rubi in the Defence of Sardinia: Letters by this Felucca dated the 25th past advise, that about 400 Men of those sent to Sardinia from Naples, had been made Prisoners by the People of the Country in their March; that the Marquess de Malaspina had found Means to convey 150 Men of his Regiment into Castel-Arragonese, and two Companies into Alguero, with above 50 Barrels of Powder, and as many of Shot, into each of those Places; and that the Marquess de Rubi finding the Garrison of Alguero inclined to Mutiny, had retired from thence in the Night and got into Castel-Arragonese.

Venice, Oct. 29. This Week arrived a Ship from Corfu, having on Board the Body of the late Vice-Admiral Flangini. The Captain of this Ship reports, that the Turkish Fleet being gone into their Ports, the Captain-General Pisani had held a Council of War, in which it was resolved to attack Previze and Vonizza, and General Schulenburg is to command in those Enterprizes. The Captain of a French Ship which is come in from Salonichi gives an Account, that the Grand Vizier
