Number of Men of War are to flay with them; but those three which were defigned for Cadiz, under the Command of Don Balthafar de Guevara, have been countermanded, and remain with the Fleet.

Vienna, Nov. 13. The Count de Charolois, Brother of the Duke of Bourbon, who ferved as a Volunteer this last Campaign against the Turks, arrived here on the 4th Instant, and having taken Leave of their Imperial Majeflies and of the Court, fet out the 7th on his Return home. The Secretary of Mr. Wortley, His Britannick Majesty's Minister at the Ottoman Port, arrived some Days ago at Belgrade, with a Letter from the Grand Vizier to Prince Eugene of Savoy; which Letter having been tranfmitted hither, was found to contain general Propofals of Peace, but no Notice was taken in it of the Emperour's Preliminary Demands which were fent by the Aga who brought to Prince Eugene the first Declaration of the Port's Difpolition to Peace. This Letter from the Grand Vizier having been confidered in Council, Prince Eugene has difpatched an Answer to it, in such Terms as were judged most convenient. Mr. Wortley's Secretary is fent for hither; when the Imperial Ministers have talked with him,
