Etters from Rome of the 14th Inftant advise, that Sig. Vincentini, the Pope's Nuncio, who had been obliged to depart the Kingdom of Naples at a fhort Warning, was arrived at Albano, where the Cardinals Paolucci, Albani, and Patricci had been to con-These Advices add, that fer with him. Count Gallas, the Imperial Ambaffadour, had fuddenly left Rome, and was gone to Naples. It was faid, that before his Departure he made feveral Demands of the Pope, the chief of which are, 1. That he should recall his Nuncio Sig. Aldovrandi from Madrid, and fend an Extraordinary Nuncio to examine his Conduct, and afterwards refide there in his Room. 2. That he should fend for Cardinal Alberoni to Rome, as the chief Author of this War. 2. That the faid Extraordinary Nuncio should inquire into the Disposal of the Money raised upon the Spanish Clergy for the War against the Turks, and revoke the Grant made of those Tenths because of the Misapplication of it. 4. That the Pope should make a like Grant to the Emperour, of the Tenths of the Revenues of the Clergy of Naples and Milan. And, 5. That he should promote the Abbot Altheim, Brother of Count Altheim the Emperour's Master of the Horfe, to the Dig-nity of Cardinal. All which Points, 'tis faid, the Pope has either refused or delays to grant.

Vienna, Dec. 18. Mr. Stanyan having had all his Audiences of Leave of the Imperial Family, as Envoy, Sir Robert Sutton and he had Audience together of the Emperour on the 16th Inftant, as his Britannick Majefty's Ambaffadours for the Mediation; but the Day of their Departure for the Ottoman Court is not yet fixed, though 'tis believed they will be going before the End of this Month.

Upon Advice that great Preparations are making in Spain for a new Imbarkation, this Court is apprehensive the Spaniards are refolved to carry the War into Italy; and being also convinced of the Pope's Partiality towards them,^t Dispofitions are making for f nding to Italy a Body of Imperial Troops. The Czarowitz is lately arrived here from Italy, with M. Telstoy, but does not appear in publick.

Paris, Jan. I. The Jesuites at Rennes having been lately convicted of teaching, That the Authority of Kings is not from God; That no Clergyman is bound to pay any Tax; That the regular Cler-gy are exempt from the Bilhop's Juifdiction; and that all Conflications, Buss, or Briefs from the Pope, though published at Rome only, bind all Christendom; the Parliament at Rennes ordered the Father Rector, the Father Prefect, and F. Andry Professor of Divinity in their College in that City, to give openly at their Bar a Recantation in Writing of those Doctrines. They did it, but subjoined that it was to comply with the Whereupon they Orders of that Court. were feverely reprimanded, and in Conclusion were obliged to give their Recantation in the ftrongest and plainest Terms. They had also the Mortification to be reproved by the Bishap, of Rennes, though a zealous Affertor of the Conftitution Unigenitus. The Rectors of feveral Parishes of Paris, have lately pre-fented a Letter to Cardinal de Noailles their Archbishop, declaring that they cannot receive the Confirmed T cannot receive the Conflicution Unige-nitus under any Modifications whatever; and that if the Explanations which the Pope may make of it contain found Doctrines, they will own them, but independently from that Conflicution. The States of Britany have fhewn fome Disposition to comply with the Demand of a Free-Gift to the King; fo that 'tis modated

ague, Dec. 20. The States of the Pro-vince of Holland re-assembled on the 24th Inftant, and having taken again into Deliberation the fitting out of a Squadron of Men of War to be fent to the Baltick, will probably come to a final Refolution in that Affair before they feparate. Most of the Provinces having fixed the Number of Troops which they accept on their Repartition, the Council of State is drawing up the general Eftablishment and Effimate of the War for the enfuing Year. We have had very ftormy Weather for fome Days paft, which has done great Damage; the Water having rifen higher than has been known in the Memory of Man, broke through feveral Digues, and has overflowed fome Parts of the Country, particularly in North-Holland, Frifeland, and Groninghen. The Danish Resident here has, by Order from his Court, propofed to the States the impowering their Minister at Copenhagen to fettle and adjust with those of the King of Denmark his Majefty's Demand: upon this State, promifing that the Ships belonging to the Subjects of this State, which have been lately fiezed by Order of his Danish Majesty, shall be discharged.

St. James's, Dec. 25. This being Chrift-mas-Day, His Majesty received the Holy Communion in His Chapel, by the Hands on the Lord Bishop of London.
