The Danish Resident here has, by Order from his Court, proposed to the States the impowering their Minister at Copenhagen to settle and adjust with those of the King of Denmark his Majesty's Demands upon this State, promifing that the Ships belonging to the Subjects of this State, which have been lately fiezed by Order of his Danish Majesty, shall be discharged.
