THE BEXLEY (FREE PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (AMENDMENT NO. 43) TRAFFIC ORDER 2000

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley, on 6th November 2000, made the above-mentioned Order, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by section 8 of, and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to, the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Bexley (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (Amendment No. 43) Traffic Order 2000, will be to:

(a) designate parking places in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge in the roads specified in the Schedule to this notice;

(b) provide that the parking places will operate at any time throughout the week;

(c) specify, in respect of the parking places in the roads in the Schedule, that disabled persons' vehicles displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge (commonly referred to as "the Orange/Blue Badge" issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badge for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 may be left therein; and

(d) provide that certain vehicles may visit in the parking places in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

A proposal notice for Lea Vale, Shenton Close, Crayford was advertised on 15th December 1999. The Council has decided to defer the introduction of this bay under section 19 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996, until a later date.

A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 13th November 2000, and the Bexley (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1989, (and of the Orders which have amended that Order), the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order, and of the maps which indicate each length of road to which the Orders relate can be inspected, during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, in The Information Centre, Civic Offices, Broadway, Bexleyheath, Kent DA6 7LB.

THE BEXLEY (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO. 103) TRAFFIC ORDER 2000

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley, on 6th November 2000, made a Traffic Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. This Order will introduce:

(a) "At any time" waiting restrictions in parts of Beech Walk, Crayford Way, Iron Mill Lane; Maiden Lane; Mill Place, and Woollett Close; and

(b) "At any time" waiting restrictions in part of Avenue Road and in the unnamed access road, from Avenue Road to Erith Sports Centre.
