ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A6 TRUNK ROAD (VARIOUS ROADS, LOUGHBOROUGH) (BUS STOP CLEARWAY) ORDER 2000

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions, hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order, under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A6 Trunk Road at Loughborough, in the county of Leicestershire.

The effect of the Order would be to prohibit any vehicle other than a bus from waiting in a bus stop area on a length of the A6 from a point 200 metres north west of its roundabout junction with Warwick Way and Bishop Meadow Road to a point 100 metres east of its junction with Cedar Road.

The Order would vary a previous order restricting waiting at bus stops. Exemptions would be provided in the Order to enable:

- (i) a vehicle to be used in connection with any building or demolition operation;
- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or its services;
- (iii) a vehicle to be used to enable the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus, for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus on or near the trunk road;

(iv) a vehicle to be used for the purposes of delivering or collecting postal packets; or

(v) a vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a plan illustrating the proposal, a copy of the Order to be varied and a statement explaining the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected, during office hours, at the offices of the Chief Executive, Leicestershire County Council, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester LE3 8RA; the Director of Corporate and Environmental Services (Administrative Services), Borough of Charnwood, Southfields, Loughborough, Leicestershire LE11 2TX, or obtained by application to the Project Services Secretariat, Highways Agency, Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL, quoting Ref. 41/2/19.

Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should send a written statement of their objection and the grounds thereof to Karen Eustace, at the Highways Agency at the address given above. The objection should quote Ref. 41/2/19, and must be received no later than 1st December 2000.
