Venice, Dec. 17. By Letters from Rome of the 14th Inftant 'tis advised, that fince the Pope's Nuncio was difmiffed from Naples, the Viceroy Count Taun has by the Emperour's Order abolished the Tribunal of the Nunciature there, as being unneceffary and burthenfome to the People. Sig. Mocenigo, Proveditore of Dalmatia, has written from thence, that he has disposed the Forces in Winter Quarters fo as to take the Field early the enfuing Spring. A Number of Seamen are imbarking here for Corfu, to fupply the Lofs of Men fuftained by our Freet last Summer in the feveral Engagements. On the 15th Sig. Pifani, Brother to the Captain-General, cauled a folemn Mass to be performed in the Church della Pieta, for the Repofe of the Souls of those who were killed in those Engagements. Mr. Cunningham, His Bri annick Majesty's Resident here, having notified to this Republick her Royal Highness the Princes of Wales's being delivered of a Prince, the Senate fent to him last Night their Compliments of Congratulation to His Majesty on this Occasion.

Madrid, Dec. 20. The Intendant Patino is on his Departure for Cadiz, to give Orders for fitting out the Galleons defigned for New-Spain. During his Stay here, he has fettled Contracts with the Undertakers for building feveral Men of War in the Ports of Biscay. The eight Ships which are arrived at Cadiz, came from the Havana on the 21st of Don Bernardo Carrafa, Col-October. lonel of the Regiment of Foot of Bafilicata, is made Lieutenant-Governour of Cagliari, and Don Francisco Bustamente is appointed Governour of Alguero. The Preparations for carrying on War by Land and Sea, are continued in this Kingdom with all Diligence.

Drefden, Dec. 22. Letters from Fraufladt of the 14th Inflant advife, that feveral of the Polish Nobility with fome Prelates, being come thither, the King had held frequent Councils; and having ving disposed of the vacant Employments and settled other Affairs, his Majefty defigned to return hither the Beginning of next Month. Laft Night the Queen arrived here from Torgau, and will refide in this City during the Winter. Count Fleming fet out from hence fome Days ago for the Court of Berlin.

Bruffels, Dec. 29. On the 20th In-ftant Count Volkra, the Imperial Minifter, proceeded from hence on his Journey to the Court of Vienna; having during his Stay here, had feveral Conferences with the Marquess de Prié, and with M. Pesters, Refident of the States General; in order to lay before the Emperour a perfect Account of the State of Affairs, in these Provinces, and of the Barrier-Treaty. M. Gronfvelt, Governour of the Province of Luxembourg, lying dangeroufly ill, the Marquess of Westerlo is appointed to succeed him.

Berne, Dec. 29, Two Deputies have been here lately from the City of St. Gall, who had in Commission to defire of the two Cantons of Zurich and Berne, that the faid City might be comprehended in the future Treaty with the new Abbat, which has been promised them; fo that they have left this Place with entire Satisfaction. The Deputies of this Stare which have been named to treat at the Congress of Baden with those of the Abbot of St. Gall, have received their Inftructions of the Sovereign Council here, and will fet out shortly to open the Conferences at that Place the 5th of next Month. It is faid that new Diforders are arifen at Neuveville, between the Bishop of Porentru and his Subjects, but 'tis hoped that Matters will timely be accommodated by the Interposition

The Parliament at Rennes in Britany have refolved to fend Deputies to Court, to give the Reasons of their Refusal to register an Arrêt lately fent to them by the Council of State, by which Arrêt the Receivers General of that Province were ordered to collect (without the Concurrence of the States) the Sum demandby the King as a Free Gift. ed The Nobility of that Province are alfo fending to Court four Deputies, chosen from among the chief Perfons of their Body. In the mean time the Troops ordered to Britany continue their March. Letters from Bayone of the 29th of December fay Mr. Bubb, late Envoy from His Britannick Mau jesty at the Court of Madridy was arrived there, and defigned to fet out Post from thence the gift on his Way hither.
