Venice, January 7.

HIS Week arrived here from Spalato Collonel Gnoftitz, Son of General Gnofitz, who is also on his Way hi-The Men of War lately launched in ther. our Arlenal, are rigging and fitting out for Sea in the Port of Malomocco. On Monday last all the Devotions of the Christmas Holydays were concluded with a folemn Pro-ceffion of the Doge and Senate in the Place of St. Mark, and with divine Service performed to Musick in the Ducal Church, which on that Occasion was illuminated. The next Night the Theatres and the Ridotto were opened, and there is already a great Concourfe of Strangers to partake of the Diversions of the Carnival. 'Tis adviled from Naples, that the Royal Officers are taking an exact Account of all the Revenues paid to the Apoftical Chamber, which are now fequestred : And that a Book has been published there, justifying the Proceedings of the Court of Vienna, and fetting forth that the Nunciature was established in that Kingdom for an hundred Years only, by Virtue of a Contract between the Pope then reigning and the Empe-rour Charles V; but that Term being expired, that Office is fallen of it felf, and befides, ought to be abolifhed as being unneceffary and oppreffive.

Vienna, Jan. 12. The 6th Inftant being the Birthday of the Empress Mother, who was born in the Year 1655, the Court was very numerous and magnificent, and her Majefty rectived the Vifits and Compliments of the Imperial Family, the Nobility, and other Perfons of Diffinction, among whom the Prince Royal of Poland and Electoral of Saxony, made a publick Appearance. All the Imperi-al Family dined and fupped that Day with the Empress-Mother. 'Tis not doubted the Empress-Confort is with Child again. General Count Merci arrived on the 6th from Temiswaer. On the 7th the Prince of Anhalt Deffau fet out from hence, on his Return home by the Way of Prague. M. Bruy. ninx, Minister of the States General at this Court, has received Letters from the Dutch Conful at Smyrna dated the 12th of No-vember, which fay that Prince Ragotski was arrived at Conftantinople; and that the late Grand Vizier who loft the Battle of Belgrade, and upon his Return to Court was banished to Salonica, had made his Escape from thence, upon Notice that an Officer was coming with an Order from the Grand Signior for his Head. 'Tis advifed from Rome, that Head. Count Gallas who retired lately from thence to Naples, with a Defign as 'twas thought to ablent himfelf for fome Time, is already returned to his Poft. The Pope's Nuncio here continues still under a Pro-hibition of coming to Court. The Talk of de Prié has nominated three Perfons for the

fending more Troops to Naples and Milan full continues, but neither the Number of them, nor the Generals to command them are yet feitled. The Elector of Trier arrived here two Days ago, and is lodg-ed at Court : It is thought he will make fome Stay here, tho' it is not known that he has any particular Bufinels to negotiate. Count Volkra is likewife arrived here.

Berne, Jan. 12. The Deputies of the two Cantons of Zurich and Berne are now affembled at Baden with those of the new Abbot of St. Gall, which last confift of four Perlons, whereof two are Laicks, and the other two Priefts. It is expected that the Demands of the Abbot will now foon he known; after which the Cantons will declare what Concessions they are disposed to make in favour of the Pacification defired. The Town of St. Gall has named two Deputies to go to Ravensberg, and Compliment on their Part the new Abbot of St. Gall upon his being railed to that Dignity.

Drefden, Jan. 12. Count Fleming has been fo much indifpoled fince his Return from the Court of Berlin, that he has not yet been out of his Houle, nor waited on the King fince his Arrival from Frauftadt. There is now no likelihood of his Majefty's going to the Fait. of Leipfick, which ends in a few Days. Two Officers of the Regiment of Seiffans, named la Croix and du Pare, who fome time ago were fiezed in the Dutchy of Deuxponts, as being acculed of a Defign against the Person of King Staniflaus, but were afterwards difmiffed, seturned hither fome Days ago : But were immediately taken into Cuftody, and have fince been imprifoned in the Caffle of Sonnestein.

Bruffels, Jan. 17. A Placart was published on the 6th of September 1716, for confilcating the Estates and Effects of such Natives of the Auftrian Netherlands, as had acted in Arms for King Philip and Aill continued in his Service; but the putting it in Execution was fulpended, upon the Representation of the most confiderable Burghers of Antwerp and other Towns of these Provinces, that it would be prejudicial to Commerce, and effectially to fuch as had Effects in Spain. By an express Order from the Court of Vienna, that Sulpenfion is newly taken off, and the Marquels de Prié has written circular Letters to the Receivers established in the feveral Provinces, directing them to proceed to the faid Confilcation; and to make first and diligent Inquiry into all clandeftine and fraudulent Conveyances and Alienations of fuch Effates or Effects as were liable to Confifcation by the faid Placart. vacant Bishoprick of Ypres, viz. M. Coriache, who during the Administration of this Government by the two maritime Powers was made Vicar General of these Provinces, Baron Dag-nies Nephew of the Bishop of Ruremonde and Dean of the Cathedral of Bruges, and M. Smits, Prefident of the Seminary at Mechlen: Which Nomination is to be fent to the Court of Vienna, for the Emperour to make Choice of one of the three.

Hague, Jan. 25. On the 19th Inftant at Night the Prince Don Emanuel of Portugal arrived here from Vienna, and has his Lodgings in the Houle of Count Tarouca, Ambaffadour from the King his Brother. He will flay here fome Time, after which he will proceed to France, and fo to Lisbon by Land. The Marquefs de Chateauneuf, Ambaffadour of France, received Advice last Week that the Duke Regent had granted him Leave (which he had been folliciting for fome Time) to quit his publick Employment here : At the fame Time the Regent has settled upon him a yearly Pen-fion of 12000 Livres, and made him a Counfellour of State. M. Morville is nominated to fucceed him here. The States General have passed a Resolution to fend forthwith an Amballadour to France, and have defired the States of the Province of Holland to name a proper Person : 'Tis thought it will be M. Buys. The faid States of Holland feparated on Friday laft: They first refolved to continue for this Year all the Taxes which were paid the preceeding Years: And on the 21st they came to a final Refoluti-on to fit out thirry Men of War, for re-establishing and securing the Commerce of the Subjects of this State in the Baltick. This Refolution was delivered Yefterday by three of their Deputies to the Affembly of the States General, who unanimoufly approved it by a Refolution paffed in Form, and agreed that this Refolution shall be communicated to the Ministers of Great Britain, France, Denmark and Sweden. The States General have nominated M. Goes, their Envoy at the Court of Denmark, to repair to the Court of Sweden, upon his Swedish Maj fty's having intimated that he was willing to receive a Minister impowered by them to treat of accommodating amicably the prefent. Differences ; but their High Mightineffes have refolved at the fame Time, that M. Goes fhall not fet out for Stockholm, till after their Refident M. Rumpf has been admitted anew at the Swedish Court. The Minister of Cologue having made preffing Inflances upon fome Pretentions of the Elector his Master, the States have given him in Writing a full Answer, containing their Reasons why they cannot comply with that Elector's Demands.
