## A PROCLAMATION,

For allowing the Importation of Swedish Iron from all Places other than from the Dominions of the King of Sweden.

GEORGE R.

Thereas in and by an Act of the last Session of Par-V liament, Intituled, An Act to enable His Majesty effectually to prohibit or restrain Commerce with Sweden, for the Reasons therein contained. it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it should and might be lawful for as, by one or more Proclamation or Proclamations, to be iffued at any Time or Times before the twentieth Day of March, which will be in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, to probibit or restrain all and every Person and Persons, Natives and Foreigners, Bodies Politick and Corporate whatfoewer, to import or bring, or cause or procure to be importted or brought, directly or indirectly, by way of Merchan-dize, into Great Britain, Ireland, or any of the Domimions thereunto belonging, any Goods, Wares, or Commodiefes what soever, of the Growth, Product, or Manufac-ture of Sweden, or any of the Dominions under the Power of the King of Sweden, being mixt or unmixt with the Goods of any other Country, or such particular Goods, Wares, or Commodities of Sweden, or of any of the Dominions under the Power of the King of Sweden, mixt or un-mixt, as aforesaid, except as is therein excepted, as in fuch Proclamation or Proclamations should be enumerated, described, and forbidden, for and during such Time and Times, not exceeding one Year, to be reckened from the twentieth Day of March, one thousand seven hundred and fixteen, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, under the Penalties in the faid Act mentioned, and in such Manner and Form as in and by such Proclamation and Proclamations respectively should be prescribed. And whereas by our Royal Proclamation, bearing date the second Day of March, one thou-fand seven hundred and sixteen. We did, under the Pe-nalties in the said Ast, prohibit and forbid all and every Person and Persons, Natives and Foreigners, Bodies Politick and Corporate what soever, before the End of the next Seffion of Parliament, which should be after the twentieth Day of March, one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, amongst other Things, to import or bring, or cause or procure to be imported or brought, directly or indirectly, by way of Merchandize, inso Great Britain, Ireland, or any the Dominions thereunto belonging, any Goods, Wares, or Commodities what soever of the Growth, Product, or Manufacture of Sweden, or any of the Dominions under the Power of the King of Sweden, other than such of the faid Goods, Wares, or Commodities, which were, or ht any Time or Times, on or before the fifteenth Day of April, one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, should be laden er put on board any Ship or Veffel in Sweden, or other foreign Parts, to be brought into Great Britain, Ireland, er any the Dominions thereunto belonging, unless we Ibbuld think fit, before the End of the next Session of Parliament, which should be after the said twentieth Day of March, one shousand seven hundred and seventeen, by bur Royal Proclamation to open the Commerce between our Subjects and those of Sweden, or to alter the Prohibitions therein contained. Now we judging it may be convenient for the present to alter the Prohibitions in our faid recited Proclamation contained, in Manner herein after recited Preclamation contained, in Manner herein after mentioned, have thought fit, by hid with the Advice of our Prvy-Council, to iffue this our Royal Proclamation: And we do hereby declare, that it shall and may be lawful for any of our Subjects to import Swedish Iron into Great Britain, Itelahd, or any of the Dominions there unto belonging, in any Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels whatsoever, which shall truly and without Fraud belong only to the Populars Great Britain or free any of the Dominions thereunto belonging, as the Propietors and right Owners thereof, and whereof the Master and

three Fourths at least of the Mariners shall be British, from any Place or Places whatsoever, other than front the Kingdom of Sweden, or from any of the Dominions-or Countries under the Power of the King of Sweden, at any Time or Times before the End of the next Session of Parliament, which shall be after the said twentieth Day of Merch, one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, any Thing in our said recited Proclamation contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding, unless we shall think fit within the Time aswessed to after this our Royal Proclamation.

Venice, Feb 5. The Senate has accepted the Offer made by the Towns of Verona, Brescia, and Trevisa, to raise each a Regiment of Foot of a Thousand Men; and the Counts Marteningo, Giusti, and Camillo Corvo, are ap-a pointed Collonels of those Regiments: 'Rir believed this Example will be followed by feveral other Towns of the Terra firma. Six feveral other Towns of the Terra firma. hundred Recruits, with Stores of Provisions, for the Garrison of Corfu, are imbarking at Malomocco, on some Transports which are to fail under the Copyoy of two new Men of Warwhich came lately out of our Arlenal; two others of the second Rare will be launched The great Snow that has fallen next Month. this Week, hinders the coming in of the Posts from feveral Places, and particularly from Rome, so that we have no fresh Advices from Corfu by the Way of Otranto.

Paris, Feb. 19. The three Deputies from the Nobility of Britany, who arrived here some Weeks ago, but could not obtain Admittance to the King, have had Orders sent to them to retire, one to Amiens, another to Rheims, and the third to Vezelay: The Deputies of the Parliament of Rennes in Britany, have not yet been able to obtain Audience. Yesterday in the Evening the Duke and Dutchess of Lorrain arrived here incognito, the Duke having taken the Name of Marquess de Blamont. On the 15th Instant the King entred into the 9th Year of his Age, on which Occasion there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility at Court.

Hague, Feb. 22. On the 18th Instant in the Morning Baron Heems, the Emperous's Envoy, had a Conference with the Deputies of this State, who delivered to him a new Renfolution of their High Mightinesses on the Affair of the Barrier, in answer to the Propositions lately made to them in Writing by the Marquess de Prie. The States of the Province of Holland continue affembled, and 'tia not doubted that before they separate they will determine every thing relating to the Squadgon designed for the Baltick; the Confent of two Provinces which is still wanting, being expected this Week. The Resident of Cologa has presented a new Memorial, in answer to the last Resolution of the States; and presses their High Mightinesses very argently to comply with the Demands of the Elector his Massier.
