HE Deputies of Zurich continue ftill here, and confer often with the Committee appointed by this State for that Purpole; but hitherto they are not come to an entire Agreement upon the feveral Points in queffion ; yet as they are willing on both Sides to finish the Affair of St. Gall in concert with one another, 'tis hoped that those Expedients of Moderation which have made the Subject of their frequent Conferences, will at laft be accepted, and this Matter finished to Satisfaction. The Sovereign Council here has lately had under Deliberation an entire Regulation for the drawing of the Lots for the feveral Bailliages and other Employments of this State, which is now adjusted; and 'tis believed that they will proceed this Year to the filling up of that Council called the Two Hundred, there being now about fourfcore Vacancies. They write from Milan of the 15th Inftant, that the Government of Lodi was to be conferred upon Count Pomaglia; that they had received Advice from Vienna, that that Court was not determined yet to fend any Troops into that Dutchy, as had been formerly given out; and that the Republick of Luca had yielded up to the Emperour divers Pofts upon the Frontiers of the Dutchy of Maffa.

Madrid, Feb. 14. Don Pedro de Cafftro, Major-General of the Spanish Foot-Guards, is fent for from Saragossa, being appointed to command the Troops which are marching to the Frontiers of

Navarre and Bifcay. Moft of the Bullion which came by the last Flota, is brought hither from Cadiz. Part of it is to be fent to Segovia to be coyned in the Mint there; and the reft is to be fent to the Mint at Cuepza. A Marriage Contract is fettled between the Marchionels of Malpica, Daughter of the Count of Altamira, and the Marquels of Santa Cruz a Nobleman of Portugal, who has conflituted his Relation the Duke of Arcos to be his Proxy for the Efpoulals. They write from Cadiz, that the two Advice-Ships defigned for Peru and New-Spain, are not yet failed from thence: That on the 6th Inftant 56 Pieces of Cannon, carrying from 24 to 48 Pound Ball, and 27 Mortars, caft in the Arfenal of Cadiz, were proved; and are to be imbarked on the first Convoy for Barcelona. Ingeniers are fent to Badajoz, Albuquerque, and Alcantara, to give Directions for repairing the Fortifications of those Places, and adding fome new Works. The new Levies raifed in the Kingdom of Leon and in the Principality of Afturias, are ordered to be incorporated into fix Battallions, four Companies of Grenadiers, and two Troops of Dragoons, which were lately brought over from Ceuta, and are now put into Quarters of Refreshment in the Neighbourhood of Cadiz. Two Battallions of feven hundred and fifty Men, raifed in Guipuscoa, are ordered to Cadiz. Tis advised from Barcelona, that the Military and Naval Preparations there are carried on very flowly at prefent, which 'twas believed proceeds from fome fecret Orders from Court to fuspend them.
