Monficur Hop, who is appointed to go with the Character of Ambassadour from this State to the Court of France is lately arrived here from Amsterdam; he has taken his Seat in the Assembly of the States General, and will set out on his Embassy as soon as his Instructions and other Dispatches, which are now under Consideration, are perfected.
