Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991 (as amended by the Environment Act 1995) that an application has been made to the Environment Agency by Yorkshire Water Services Ltd, Western House, Halifax Road, Bradford BD6 2SZ, for consent to discharge 1,254.5 cubic metres of treated sewage effluent, settled storm sewage effluent and sewage effluent under storm and/or emergency conditions (following power failure or mechanical breakdown) from Mickfield (New) Waste Water Treatment Works (a new facility being built to replace the existing sewage treatment works) at Mickfield WWTW, off Great North Road, Mickfield, Leeds into Sheep Dike at National Grid Ref SE 4514 3326.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW OF AN INLAND WATER BY MEANS OF IMPOUNDING WORKS

Take notice that The Wildlife Trust for Lancashire Manchester and North Merseyside (Greater Manchester Office), of 125 Blackburn Road, Bolton BL1 8MF, is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of Red Moss Ditch System, at National Grid Ref SD 635 104, at Red Moss (SSSI), Horwich, Bolton.

Water will be impounded by staged weirs, and the object of the impounding works is restoration and creation of raised mire habitat. (The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be 20,000 cubic metres). Maintain conditions to recreate mossland habitat.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR CONSENT IN PURSUANCE OF SCHEDULE 10

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991 as amended by the Environment Act 1995, that an application has been made to the Environment Agency by RMC Aggregates (Eastern Counties) Limited, for consent to discharge trade effluent. The application is for consent to discharge up to a maximum of 5,000 cubic metres per day of trade effluent from Passenham Quarry, Passenham, Milton Keynes, Buckinghamshire, into the River Great Ouse at National Grid Ref SP 7755 3938.

The scheme is to discharge groundwater to prevent interference with sand and gravel extraction via settling lagoons and a ditch to the River Great Ouse.

Passenham Quarry is within the South Northamptonshire Council and Northamptonshire County Council areas.

The receiving watercourse has a number of recognised uses. These include cyprinid fishery, industrial water supply, spray irrigation of field crops and livestock watering, high amenity and conservation.
