Buda, March 13.

Eight Hundred Heydukes lately listed in these Parts to compleat Count Gyalay's Regiment, are on their March to join the said Regiment in Italy. Recruits daily pass by this Place towards the Quarters of the several Imperial Regiments for which they were raised, as do likewise great Numbers of Horses for remounting the Cavalry, and it is hoped our Army will be ready to take the Field by the Beginning of next Month. It is said the Campaign will be opened by the Siege of Bihatz, a very strong Castle on the River Unna in Croatia, in which Service a Detachment of 16000 Men is to be employed: Some Turkish Parties advanced lately towards the Imperial Quarters on that Side, but retired with Precipitation upon the Approach of our Troops that were sent out against them. We hear a Body of Turks and Tartars is assembling towards Widin, with Intent to make an Incurfion into Walachia and Tranfylvania.

Naples, March 15. Upon the Advices we have received that the Spaniards are sending Reinforcements of Troops to their Army in Sardinia, and transporting thither considerable Supplies of Ammunition and other Stores our Viceroy has given repeated Orders for hastening the Repairs of the Fortifications of several Places in this Kingdom, particularly those of Capua, to which some new Works are to be added, and for filling their Magazines with warlike Stores, and doing whatever else may be necessary to put them in the best Posture of Defence. Directions are given in this City, and in the other chief Towns, to prevent clandestine Meetings of Persons suspected of Disaffection to the Government, several of whom have been ordered to depart out of the Kingdom; and Numbers of Vagabonds, the looseness of whose Morals makes them unprofitable Members of the Commonwealth, and dangerous to the publick Peace in Case of any Disturbance, have been seized both here and in the Country, and secured in our Arsenal and other Places of Safety, in order to be sent to serve in the Army in Hungary. The Leopold Man of War, and some other Ships of Force, and the Gallies of this Kingdom, are sailed for Istria, to convoy the Transport Ships which are to bring from thence the Imperial Troops that are ordered hither, a considerable Part of which are already arrived at Fiume, where they are to embark; and it is said, that as soon as the Season will permit a Camp is to be formed in the Neighbourhood of Capua, as the most proper Place for our Troops to be at hand to oppose a Descent, if the Spaniards should attempt to make one upon our Coasts,

Genoa, March 22. The warlike Preparations that are making in our Neighbourhood, have induced our Senate to provide likewise for the Safety of their Territories; in order to which two Regiments are raising here, and another in the Island of Corsica, to reinforce our Garrisons, and a good Quantity of Ammunition is bought to be laid up in our Magazines. Six Spanish Men of War are lately come into Porto Longone, where the Spaniards have got together a considerable Quantity of warlike Stores. It is said the Rendezvous of their Fleet is to be at Cagliari, and that Orders are sent to all their Cruizers to repair thither forthwith, except four that are to continue in the Adriatick Gulph, to endeavour to intercept the Supplies of Troops and Ammunition that are to be transported from Fiume in Istria to the Kingdom of Naples.

Berne, March 30. The Deputies of this Canton who are employed in the Treaty now on foot for restoring Peace and good Neighbourhood with the Abbot and Chapter of St. Gall, are shortly expected here from Baden, to receive fresh Instructions upon some Matters that do yet remain in Dispute between that Abbot and the Canton of Appenzel and City of St. Gall. They leave their Secretary behind them to transact in their Absence, and are to return thither after the Easter Holidays; and as the principal Points of that Negotiation are said to be fully adjusted, we hope to see it soon brought to a good Issue. Letters from Milan of the 22d past say, they were working with great Application upon the Repairs of the Fortifications of that Town and Citadel, and that Orders were given for doing the like at Tortone, Novara, and other Places of that Dutchy, whose Magazines were also filling with Ammunition and other Stores of War; and that the Duke of Parma was likewise putting Placentia and the other Frontier Towns of his Territories into a Posture of Defence, and had reinforced his Garrisons.

Whitehall, April 4. His Majesty has been pleased to direct Letters Patents to pass the Great Seal of Ireland for creating the Right Honourable Charles Fane, Esq; a Viscount and Baron of that Kingdom by the Name, Stile and Title of Viscount Fane, and Baron of Loughuyre, in the County of Limerick.

London, April 4. On the 22d of March last was launched at Lime-House, the Ship Royal George, belonging to the South Company, whose Burthen contains 630 Tons one Tenth.
