ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A16 TRUNK ROAD (MAIN ROAD, UTTERBY, LINCOLNSHIRE) (40 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2001

The Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions, hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on a length of

the A16 Trunk Road (Main Road) at Utterby, in the county of Lincolnshire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 3 September 2001, will be to impose a 40 miles per hour speed limit on the length of the A16 Trunk Road between points 75 metres and 100 metres north-west of its junction with Chapel Lane. This will extend the length currently subject to a 40 miles per hour speed limit by 25 metres.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan illustrating the proposals and a statement of the Secretary of State's reasons for making the Order may be inspected during opening hours at the offices of East Lindsey District Council, Tedder Hall, Manby Park, Louth, Lincolnshire; at Utterby Stores & Post Office, Main Road, Utterby, Louth, Lincolnshire, or may be seen at or obtained by application to Karen Eustace at the Highways Agency, Operations Division Secretariat, Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL.
