THE CAMDEN (DISABLED PERSONS) (AMENDMENT NO) TRAFFIC ORDER 2001

Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the London Borough of Camden propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under section 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

The general effect of the (Disabled Persons) Order will be to create new disabled persons' free parking places, outside Nos 3 Prince Arthur Road, 27 Fitzjohn's Avenue, 27 Ferncroft Avenue, 11 Gardner House, Redhill Street, Saffron Hill and to provide that the vehicles which may be left in those parking places shall be those displaying a valid permit issued by any Council. ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 23 PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF ZEBRA CROSSINGS

The Council of the London Borough of Camden, having consulted the Metropolitan Police and the Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that it intends:

To introduce a new zebra crossing in England's Lane at a point which lies north-east of the north-eastern kerbline of Belsize Park Gardens with the zig-zag markings (8 sets) extending on either side, except for those on the east side, north-western kerbside of England's Lane, which will extend for a distance of 6 metres (2 sets only); and

To introduce a new zebra crossing in Belsize Park Gardens at a point which lies to the north-west of the north-western kerbline of England's Lane and with (4 sets) of the zig-zag markings extending on north side and (2 sets only) extending on the south side.

A plan, drawing number PCL/536/008-008B-A, showing the proposed crossing locations may be inspected during normal office hours at the Environment Department Reception desk at the address mentioned below.
