Vienna, & 11 9. The Emperor having accepted the Proposals made him on the Part of Great Britain and France, for preferving the Peace of Chriftendom by an Accommodation of the Differences between his Imperial Majefty and the King of Spain; the Ministers here are daily in Conference to fettle the Form of a Treaty for that Purpose. We have an Account from Belgrade, that the Ottoman Port likewife shews a good Dispofition towards Peace, having in great Measure agreed to the Preliminaries propofed on the Part of his Imperial Majefty ; that M. Collier the Dutch Ambaffadour at the Port, who is to act as Mediator jointly with the Ambaffadours of Great Britain, and Ibrahim Effendi and Mahomet Effendi, the two Turkish Plenipotentiaries, were fet out from Sophia for Fetiflau, the Place of Congress, and that M. Dahlman the Emperour's fecond Plenipotentiary, was on his Departure thither from Belgrade. Orders are fent for the Saxon Forces which the Emperour has lately taken into his Service to march to Hungary. They write from Fiume in Istria, that a Fleet of Transport Ships under the Convoy of fome Men of War was failed from thence, having on Board the Regiments of Count Maximilian Staremberg, Count Guido Staremberg, and General Wetzel, for the Kingdom of Naples.

Hague, April 22. Upon the Arrival of an Express with the welcome News of the Emperour's Acceptance of the Propofals made him by the King of Great Britain and the Regent of France, for composing the Differences between the Houfe of Auftria and the King of Spain, Mr. Whitworth the British Edvoy, and M. Chateauneuf the French Ambaffadour, had a Conference Yesterday with the Deputies of the States General. The States of Holland and Weft Friseland will adjourn to Morrow till the 25th, to! allow Time for the Deputies of the feveral Towns of this Province to give their respective Magistrates an Account of the feveral Refolutions they have lately taken.

Deputies from the levéral Ádiniralties are expected here next Week to lay before the States General an Account of their Proceedings, particularly with respect to the Squadron that is fitting out for the Baltick. The Marquis de Prié is also expected very foon from the Bruffels, to put the last Hand to a Treaty for adjufting feveral Matters relating to the Barrier of the Austrian and Dutch Netherlands.
