Madrid, April 11.

THE Detachment of the Holfe Guards commanded by Lieutenant General Don Francisco Gaetano, began their March lately towards Catalonia, and, as is said, will shortly be followed by another Detachment. The Marquis de Lede, Direcfor General of the Spanish Foot, has been to review those quartered in Biscay and Navarre, from whence he is fhortly expected here to give the King an Account of their Condition, and will afterwards be fent to review those in Valentia and Catalonia. The Intendant Patin is sent for from Cadiz to put the last Hand to the new Regulations for the better Government of our Finances. Letters from Barcelona fay, that the Transport Ships were ready to carry off the last of the Forces defigned from those Parts for Sardinia, waiting only for the Arrival of the Convoy from Cadiz, in Company with which they were to proceed to that

Milan, April 12. Our Magistrates have frequent Meetings to confult upon finding Funds for raising a sufficient Sum to furnish out a considerable Train of Artillery, which is ordered to be forthwith got in a readiness for the Service of the Imperial Forces in this Dutchy. As also to buy up Ammunition to fill our Magazines. General Colmenero, who commands the Garrison of our Citadel, uses all possible Diligence in repairing its Fortifications, and in supplying it with Provisions and Warlike Stores, and doing whatever else may be requisite to put it in the best Posture of Desence; in order to which he has caused several Houses that were built too near the Works to be pulled down, the Materials whereof are made use of to build Storehouses and Barracks for the Garrison. General Zumjungen is lately arrived here from Vienna. Count Staremberg with his Lady have lest this Place, in order to return to the Imperial Court.

Genoa, April 12. The Imperial Minister here had an Audience Yesterday of the Senate, to whom he delivered a Memorial complaining that their Officers have entertained in the new Levies which are

making for the Service of this State, great Number of Men that deferred from the Emperour's Troops in the Mir lanese, upon the Encouragement of extraordinary Levy-Money, demanding that such of them as shall be reclaimed may be delivered up; and that strict Orders be given to prevent the like un neighbourly Practice for the future. He was acquainted that he should receive a speedy Answer, and the Senate intend to meet the 14th, to take the said Memerial into Consideration. We have an Account by some Vessels larely come in here from the Coast of Barbary, that the several Governments of Algiers, Tunis and Tripoly had received fresh Orders from the Porte, to hasten the Departure of the Squadrons which they are to fend as usual to join the Ottoman Fleet; and that they were accordingly fitting out their Ships with all possible Diligence. Letters from Palermo give an Account, that a great Convoy which had been preparing there fome time, to bring Recruits and Supplies of Ammunicion and other Stores for the King of Sicily's Forces in Piedmont, put to Sea the 26th past; but was forced back by a very great Storm, which shattered and dispersed their Ships, whereof 14 Transport Vessels were still missing on the 4th Instant. They write from Naples, that several German Regiments were arrived there from Fiume, for the supplying of whose Room in the Imperial Army employed against the Turks, the Italian Regiments in the Kingdom of Naples were to be transported to Fiume, in order to march from thence to join the faid Army in Hungary.

Number both of Sea and Land Men, that have been raised here for the Emperour's Service, were lately sent away for Hungary. They write from the Dutchy of Mecklembourg, that they were at Work upon some new Forustications which their Duke had ordered to be erected for the Security of his Town of Rostock. Letters from Petersbourg give an Account of the Czar's Arrival there, and that he had brought with him Prince Alexander his eldest Son, whom he lately disinherited. These Advices add, that before he lest Moscow having discovered a Con-

spiracy entered into by divers Persons of Note, to fet aside the Settlement he has made of the Succession to his Crown, and all his new Regulations for the Improvement of Arts and Sciences in his Dominions, he had inflicted exemplary Punilhment upon those who were concerned in it; particularly the Patriarch of Rolfoff was broken alive upon the Wheel, then beheaded, his Head set upon a Pole, and his Body burnt; the Sieur Kikency, who formerly enjoyed a good Share of his Czarish Majesty's Favour, who had promored him to the Order of Knighthood of the White Eagle, was executed in the same, manner; as was likewise Major-General Gleboff, after he had endured the greatest Torture to bring him to a Confession of the Particulars of this Defign, of which certain Papers found upon him were a material Evidence; the Sieur Backlonoff, one of the Czar's Pages, had his Tongue, his Nose and his Ears cut off; Prince Dalgorucky was condemned to perpetual Banishment, and the Princess Gallitzen to Imprisonment for Life, and many of an inferior Rank were punish'd, some with Death, others with Banishment, Corporal Punishments being inflicted on the rest, according to the Degree of their Guilt.

Berne, April 20. Our Sovereign Council of Two Hundred on the 11th Instant came to a Resolution to fill up Fourscore Places that were vacant in that Assembly, for which there appeared a great Number of Candidates, as being the greatest Honour a Member of this Commonwealth can arrive to, besides that Employments of Trust and Profit are always bestowed by the said Council upon some of their own Body; and on the 15th the Election came on, and has fallen upon fuch Persons as have met with general Approbation. The 18th our Avoyer or Chief Magistrate, of whom there are two who execute that Office alternately for a Year, entered upon his Function with the usual Solemnity: Yesterday a new Treasurer, whose Office is likewise Temporary, was chofen; and to Morrow the vacant Bailywicks are to be disposed of by Lot, according to a Regulation made in that behalf in the Year 1710. Our Deputies for the Treaty to accommodate the Differences between the Abbot and Chapter of St. Gall and his Neighbours and Vaffals, are upon their Return to Baden to meet those of the Canton of Zurich and of the faid Abbot; and as all the material Points are adjusted, we hope foon to see a good Issue of this Negotiation, and an End thereby put to a Difpute that has occasioned no small Disturbances in these Parts.
