## Buda, April 20.

CIR Robert Syston, Ambaffadour Extraor. dinary and Plenipotentiary from His Majefty of Great Britain, as Mediator for the Treasy of Peace between the Emperour and the Ottoman Porte, arrived here Yefterday by Water from Vienna. His Excellency was faluted with a Difcharge of our Cannon, and entertained at Dinner by the Baron of Leffenholtz, our Governour, and this Day proceeded on his Journey by Water towards Bel. grade ; where Baron Dahlman, the Emperour's fecond Plenipotentiary for that Treaty, waite his Arrival, and they are from thence to go to Paffarowitz, the Place of Congress.

Constantinople, March 20. The Turkish Men of War and Gallies that have been fitting out in this Port being now in a Condition to put to Sea, the Horle Tails have been expoled as a Signal to the Officers and Seamen to repair to their Pofts. Six Men of War that had been fent to the Archipelago to fetch Seamen and Ammunition from the feveral Turkish Ports in those Seas are returned, and have brought with them five Venetian Prizes, and a Veffel belonging to Malta which they took in their Voyage. The Barbary Squadron, confifting of 34 Ships of Force, is shorily expected, and when our Fleet has receiv'd that Reinforcement it will fail for the Archipelago, to encounter the Venetian Fleet. The Afiatick Troops which are to serve in Hungary this Campaign, are all arrived here, to the Number of about 28000 Men, and are forthwith to proceed on their March to join the Turkish Army. About 60 Saicks and other Veffels are getting ready in this Port, to carry a Train of Artillery and Supplice of Ammunition and other Warlike Stores up the Danube for the Ule of our Troops in All the Foreign Ministers are gone Hungary. to attend the Sultan at Adrianople, except M. Bonac, the French Ambaffadour, who waits the Return of a Courier he fent fome Time ago to Paris.

Vienna, April 23. The Emperour held a Council the 20th Inftant, in which the Inftructions for his Ministers who are to transact the Negotiation for a Peace with the Turks were perfected ; and Yefterday Count Virmond, his Imperial Majefty's first Plenipotentiary for that Treaty, went from hence towards Paffarowitz. The Cavalier Ruzzini, Ambaffadour and Plenipotentiary from the Republick of Venice, will fet out the 25th on his Journey thither. By all our Advices from Turkey the Grand Signior and his Divan shew so good a Disposition sto Peace, that there is all Reason to hope that Negatization will in a fhort Time be happi. ly concluded.

Stockholm, March 28. Baron Gortz came hither about three Weeks ago, and had feveral Conferences with our Governour, to confult upon the Means of proviof providing Supplies of Corn, which is become and among very fcarce in this Kingdom,

one was to oblige the Merchants of this City to fend for a certain Quantity from foreign Parts; they were accordingly fent for by the Governour, and commanded in the King's Name to import 100000 Barrels of Wheat before the End of next Summer, upon Penalty of forfeiting a Rixdollar for every Barrel they shall fall short of that Number. They were ordered at the same Time to de-liver forthwith 6000 Tun of Iron to the Chamber of Negociation for the King's Service, for which they are to take Copper Mint Tokens in Payment. Orders are likewife fent to the Burghers of Gottembourg, upon the like Penalties, to import 50000 Barrels of Corn, and to deliver 5000 Tan of Iron for the King's Ufe. Some Libels having been dispersed here containing Threats against Baron Gortz, as one whole Councils have chiefly contributed to the Preffures under which the People suffer, he thought it convenient, during his Stay here, to have a Guard of Sol-The diers to secure him from any Infult. King having defired an Interview with the Princels Royal his Sifter, the Duke of Holftein, and the Hereditary Prince of Heffe, at Christinahamb, a small Town in the Province of Wermland on the Frontier of Norway; the Prince of Heffe and the Princels accordingly fet out from hence the 14th Instant, in order to repair thi-ther; and they were followed the 18th by the Duke of Holftein and Baron Gortz. The Sieurs Trobelskoys and Gollowyn, two Muscovite Generals, who being taken Prisoners of War, have been several Years under Confinement, are lately brought hither, in order, as is faid, to be fet at Liberty

Hague, May 6. The States General have notified to the feveral Provinces, that the British and French Ministers refiding here have communicated to them a Project of a Treaty for accommodating the Differen-ces between the Emperour and the King of Spain, and acquainted them that their respective Masters desire the Concurrence of this Republick in their Endeavours to bring this Negotiation to a good Iffue, the Terms of which are already accept-ed by the Emperour. The States of the refpective Provinces have accordingly taken this Matter into Confideration, and those of Friseland have already fent up their Confent to this State's concurring in the Measures propoled, expressing their Sense of the great Wifdom and Sagacity of His British Majesty and the Regent of France in projecting fuch Terms as are fo adapted to the feveral Interests of the respective Powers concerned, that there is no Room to doubt but that as the Emperour has already done, the other Parties will chearfully embrace the Proposal, and that we may foon fee the Prospect of a fatal War in Europe changed into that of a folid and lafting Peace and Tranquility. The Marquis de Prie is daily expected here to put the last Hand to the adjusting of Matters relating to the Bar-rier.
