## Madrid, May 2.

HE 29th paft at Night the King of Spain was feized with an Indifpoli with aguilh and feverish Fits, which conti nued upon him till the next Day at Noon, and hath confined him to his Chamber. A Courier is lately arrived from Rome with Advice, that the Pope ftill refules to grant his Bulls for Cardinal Alberoni's taking Pof-feffion of the Archbishoprick of Seville; up-on which the Council has met feveral Times to confider of proper Measures for afferting the King's Prerogative on this Occafion, and it is faid that Directions will be given that no Person promoted to Ecclesiastical Digni-ties in his Majesty's Dominions shall apply to the Pope for his Bulls till he has granted thole demanded for the faid Cardinal, The Intendant Patin is lately returned from Ca. diz; the King has given him a Commande-rie of the Military Orders, vacant by the Death of the Duke de Linares worth 4000 Ducats a Year. He is frequently in Conference with the Ministers upon the new Regulations propoled for the better Managewho have formerly farmed the Blace of Di-vings that are agreed why the Place of Di-vings that are agreed why the Place of Director General of the Posts and Couriers is to be suppressed, and that Business to be managed by an Officer who is to be under the Direction of the Council of the Finances, and to have a moderate Salary. Letters from Barcelona of the 16th paft fay, that the Convoy of Men of War and Transport-Ships bound from thence to Sardinia, put to Sea the 13th, having on board three Regiments of Foot and a confiderable Quantity of Amplification and other Stores of War. They weightfrom Cadiz of the 18th, that two Shipting ded thence the 16th for the Havana, and an Advice Boat for Cartagena.

Vienna, April 30. Count Virmond, the Emperour's first Plenipotentiary for treating of a Peace with the Turks, who embarked here on the Danube the 22d Inftant for Belgrade, in order to repair from thence to the Place of Congress, has been detained some time by bad Weather at Petronella, but the Seafon coining fair he proceeded on his Voyage. Cáva-'ier Ruzzini, the Venetian Plenipotentiary, folwed him the 28th. And as our Advices from Hungary fay the Turkish Plenipotentiaties are already come to Paffarowitz, and express a great Defire of bringing this Negotiation to a good Iffue, we hope it will foon be concluded. However, the Imperial Troops are ordered to march from their Quarters towards Semlin, the chief Place of their Rendezvous, and fuch of the Officers appointed to ferve in Hungary as are in Town, are on their Departure thither. Count Czaky, Archbishop of

Colocza, being promoted to the Dignity of a Cardinal, has received the Cap from the Emperour's Hands in the Church of the Augustines in this City, with the usual Ceremony.

Drefden, May 4. The Saxon Troops lately put into the Emperour's Service were reviewed the 29th past on our Frontier by General Fleming, and the 1st Instant they were delivered over to the Imperial Commissions at Grothe, a Town on the Borders of Silelian These Troops having by Defertion loss about 300 Meh, a Draught is made out of the several Regiments in Garrison here to complete them. As the fending to many of our Forces into Foreign Service has left our Garrisons very empty, new Levies will shortly be made to supply them.

Paris, May 14. The Pope refuling to grant his Bulls to those who are promoted to Ecclefiaftical Dignities in this Kingdom, till his Conflictution Unigenitus is entitely fubmitted to, the Marshals deVilleroy and d'Uxelles, the Dukes de St. Simon and d'Antin, and the Marquis de Torcy, are appointed a Committee to confider of a Method to put them in Poffemon of their Benefices without applying to the Court of Rome, upon which they are to take the Opinions and Advice of the Archbishops and Bishops, the Faculty of Divinity of the Sorbonnes the feveral Universities and Parliaments, and of Persons eminent for their Learning in the Civil and Canon Law. The Archbishop of Roan, in a Visitation of his Diocele, having suspended the Curate of one of the Parishes of Diepe, for refusing to comply with the faid Confliction, it occasioned a Tumule among the Inhabitants, which could not be appeafed but by the Archbishop's taking off his Sulpension. The Duke of Bourbon fet out from hence Yesterday Morning for Dijon, to be present in the Alfembly of the States of Burgundy, in which he is to prefide as Gover-nour of that Province. Great Sums of Money have been collected in the feveral Parishes of this City, for the Relief of those who faffered by the late Fire.

Hague, May 17. The Earl Cadogan, His Majefly of Great Britain's Ambaffadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, arrived here the 15th Infrant from England, having landed at the Brill. His Excellency has fittee been vifited by the publick Ministers and other Perfons of Diftunction. The States of Holland and Weff-Frifeland, who were adjourn'd fome Days ago, are shortly to meet again. The King of Sicily's Agent being recalled, is preparing for his Departure; the Minister from that Court who is to fucceed him, is expected in a few Days, part of his Equipage being already arrived.
