Madrid, May 9.

THE King is so well recovered that to Day he dressed and received the Visits of the Nobility. Next Week their Majesties design to go to Balsain. On the 5th Instant the Intendant Don Joseph Patino set out from hence for Barcelona, to see what Forwardness the Naval Preparations there are in. The *Hermione* and the *Pearl*, two Men of War which went with the last Convoy to Sardinia, are returned to Barcelona. The King has given the Government of the Citadel of Barcelona to Engineer General Verboom, in Consideration of his Services, and particularly of his Care and Skill in the Building of that Citadel; and Don Gaspar de Antona, Colonel of the Regiment of Leon, is made Lieutenant Governour. Don Domenico del Giudice, Duke of Giovenazzo, a Grandee of Spain, and Counsellor of State, died some Days ago in the 81st Year of his Age. He had given signal Proofs of his Capacity, of his Zeal, and of his Attachment to the Service of his Majesty in several great Employments. He had been Ambassadour in France, Portugal, and Savoy, and Viceroy of Arragon. He was Brother of Cardinal del Giudice, and Father of the Prince of Cellamare, Ambassadour from this Crown at the Court of France.

Copenhagen, May 17. Some Vessels which sailed from hence for Lubeck three Days ago returned into Harbour Yesterday, and reported that they had seen 12 Swedish Men of War off Mœn. Upon which Admiral Raab sailed this Morning from this Road with four Men of War, to join Commadore Tordenchiold who is in the Bay of Koge with four Men of War and two Frigates. Four or five Ships more are getting ready to follow.

Dresden, May 18. On the 12th Instant, being the King's Birthday, the Countess of Denhoff gave on that Occasion a magnificent En-

tertainment, at which were present the Pope's Nuncio, the Envoys of the Czar and of France, Prince Radzivil, and the rest of the Polish Senators, with several other Persons of Distinction. On Sunday last a new Edict of the King's was published in all the Churches of this City and throughout the Electorate, by which his Majesty renews his Promises to protect the Protestant Religion in these his Dominions. The same Day his Majesty set out for Torgau, to take Leave of the Queen, who is to set out to Morrow for the Baths near Bareith; where she was last Summer. His Majesty is expected back here this Evening. Yesterday Morning died General Janus, Governour of this City.

Berne, May 18. Our last Advices from Baden tell us, that the Conferences had begun there anew, since the Arrival of the Deputies of the Two Cantons, and those of the Abbot and Chapter of St. Gall; That they had under Deliberation the 79th Article of the Treaty of Roschach, which related to the Sovereignty the Abbot pretends to in some Places in the County of Turgaw; That the Deputies of the Abbot were willing to consent to this Article, according to the Project made at Berne, but that those of Zurich had refused to consent to it without Orders from their Masters, to whom they had sent an Express for that Purpose; and that 'twas hop'd, that this Article being once agreed to, the rest of them would soon be settled, and the Treaty concluded in a short Time. It is advised from Turin, that Count Fontana, a Person well vers'd in the Pretensions of that Court and that of Vienna, had been sent for by the King of Sicily to La Venerie, from whence after having had a long Conference with his Majesty, he was dispatched in great Haste to Vienna, to join there the Count d'Uffol, who has been employed there for some Time in private Negotiations.
