Paris, May 25. On the 16th Instant the King accompanied by the Duke du Maine, the Marshal Duke de Villeroy his Governour, and the Bishop of Frejus his Preceptor, went the first time to Meudon, to visit the Dutchess of Ventadour who was formerly his Governess, and after an Entertainment returned hither the same Evening. M. de Morville is to set out next Week on his Embassy to Holland. The Commissioners appointed to consider of Means for redressing the Inconveniences arising by the Pope's delaying to grant his Bulls to Persons nominated to Ecclesiastical Benefices, have met several Times, and consulted some eminent Lawyers; but a Courier is arrived from Cardinal de la Trimouille, with Advice that the Pope has actually given Direction for the Dispatch of the Bulls required.
