Letters from Vienna relate, that the great naval Arsenal at Constanti-nople having been set on Fire by Accident, was confumed with all the Timber and other Stores that were in it. The Plenipotentiaries at Passarowitz had held several Conferences, to form some Regulations in Order to the

opening of the Congress.
