Venice, June 3.

ON the 30th past a Number of Transports sailed for Corfu, under a Convoy commanded by Sig. Morocini, and others are preparing to follow them with a good Number of Italian Recruits, and two second Rate Men of War, the Rose and the Swan, are appointed for their Convoy. On the 1st Instant the Senate received Letters from Corfu by the Way of Otranto, which relate that the Fleet was in a Readiness to sail; that the Captain-General had held a Council of War, but that the Resolutions taken in it were not known; and that the Garrisons of Corfu, Sta. Maura, Prevesa, and Vonizza, were all put into a sufficient State of Defence. The Pope has granted towards the Charge of the War against the Turks, a Subsidy of 500000 Crowns, for this Year only, out of the Revenues of the Clergy of this Republick. On the 2d, a Pink arrived from Spalato, with Letters advising, that Sig. Sebastian Mocenigo was gone from thence to Clin and Zara, to review the Troops in those Parts, where great Preparations were making for a vigorous Campaign.

Vienna, June 4. 'Tis advised from Belgrade the 27th past, that the Imperial Troops were drawing together in the Plain of Semlin; where several General Officers were already arrived. Some of the Turkish Troops had begun likewise to move out of their Quarters: On the 25th, 600 Spahis commanded by an Ali-Begh attacked Veillova, which was de-

fended by a Rascian Captain with only 150 Heydukes; but the Turks were beaten off in two Attacks, with the Loss of 16 of their Men. Prince Eugene being on his Departure from hence for the Army, has caused a considerable Sum of Money to be distributed among the Poor of this City; and ordered Mass to be said every Day in St. Stephen's Cathedral, for Success on his Enterprizes during this Campaign. To Day a great Council was held at Laxembourg in the Presence of the Emperour, who has written a Letter to the Cardinal of Saxe-Zeits his Commissioner at Ratisbon, directing him to represent to the Dyet in pressing Terms, the Necessity of the Empire's furnishing his Imperial Majesty with new Subsidies, till an honourable Peace can be had with the Turks. The Conferences at Passarowitz are suspended till the Return of the Courier whom the Turkish Plenipotentiaries have sent to Adrianople for new Full Powers and Instructions.

Berne, June 8. According to our last Advices from Baden, the 8th Article of the Treaty of Roschach, relating to a Sovereignty the Abbot of St. Gall pretends to in some Places in the County of Turgaw, being at last adjusted between the Deputies of the Two Cantons and those of the Abbot, the Treaty was upon the Point of being concluded: The Rati-fications are to be exchanged in three Months. The Marquis d'Avarey Ambassadour of France, before his Departure from Soleurre, wrote to this Canton to notify to them his taking a Turn to Court, from whence he should be back shortly; but that in the mean time
