N Humble Address of the Grand Jury of Barbados, was presented to His Majesty by the Agents of the Gid Island, introduced by the Right Honourable Mr. Se-

An Address of the President and other principal Inhabitants of the Island of St. Christopher, has likewise been presented to His Majesty by Collonel Matthews, Lieutenant General of the Leeward Mands, and Lieutenant Governour of the said Island of St. Christopher, introduced by the Right Honourable Mr. Secretary Craggs.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Algiers, March 29. On the 9th of this Month Ali Bashaw, our Dey, fell ill of a Fever, of which he died the 25th in the Evening, having governed this State seven Years and seven Months, and concluded his Administration with this peculiar Felicity, that he left it in Peace, and died a natural Death, in that Station, which has never happened but to one of his Predecessors. The 26th, early in the Morning, a Divan was held, in which Mohamet, who was Treasurer to the deceased Dey, was elected his Successor, and immediately took Possession of his Office. About an Hour after Mr. Thompson, the British Consul, went to Congratulate him upon his Advancement to the Government, and required him to confirm the Articles of Peace between His Majesty of Great Britain and this State; the Dey received him with Marks of great Respect to His Majesty, and of Kindness and Civility towards His Minister, and readily consented to what the Conful defired, which he has fince performed by executing a Confirmation in Form of the faid Treaty, accompanying it with Promiles of ufing his best Endeavours to cultivate Peace and a good Correspondence with the British Nation.

Belgrade, May 31. A confiderable Number of Cannon has lately been brought hither by Water from Buda and other Places, to be planted upon the new Fortifications lately added to this Town, which by the great Care and Diligence of Count Odwyer, who has had the chief Direction of those Works, and of the Repairs of the old ones, is put into a far better State of Defence than while it was in the Possession of the Turks. Train of Artillery for the Service of our Army is likewife arrived at Semlin, near which Place the Troops come in daily, and in very few Days the whole Army will be encamped. Count Mercy is drawing together another Body of Imperial Troops upon the Banks of the Danube, at some Distance below this Place. A Bridge is making on the Danube near Semendria, after the finishing of which, three other Bridges will be built

on that River at proper Distances, and great Numbers of Pioneers and Country People are employed in clearing the Ways about our Camp, as well for the Conveniency of bringing Provifions and other Necessaries to it, as for the Ease of the Troops whenever they shall have Occafion to march. In the mean Time the Ministers of the several Powers who are employed to negociate a Treaty of Peace between the Emperour, the Venetians, and the Ottoman Porte, are settling their Quarters at Passarowitz; but there is a Complaint of Scarcity, of Provisions, especially in the Quarter of the Turkish Ambassadours, who have desired the Imperialists that they may be supplied for their Money from our Side of the Country, which was readily granted, and Paf-fes are given them for that Purpose. A Turkish Aga who came lately with some Dis-patches from Adrianople to the Ministers of the Porte at the Congress, returning home through our Quarters, Care was taken to fhew him the good Condition of our Troops, and the Forwardness they are in towards taking the Field, that he might be able to undeceive the Sultan, whom, as it was reported, Count Ragotski had endeavoured to persuade that the Designs of the Spaniards on the Emperour's Territories in Italy would cause fuch a Diversion of his Forces as to oblige him to weaken his Army in Hungary to a considerable Degree. The Turks are drawing together some Troops near Nissa, but are fo backward in their Preparations that their Army cannot be formed fooner than the End of next Month.

Buda, June 4. Prince Eugene of Savoy ar-rived here the 2d Instant by Water from Vienna; he was received at the Water side by Baron Loffenholz our Governour, and saluted by a treble Discharge of our Cannon. His Highness, without making any Stay, pur-sued his Voyage towards Belgrade, in order to take upon him the Command of the Imperial Army. Supplies of Men, Artillery and Warlike Stores are daily passing by this Place for the Army, the greatest Part of which is already arrived at the general Rendervous in the Plains of Semlin; and all Accounts agree, that never were feen Regiments more

compleat and better appointed.

Copenhagen, June 11. The British Squadron

Copenhagen, June 11. The British Squadron under the Command of Admiral Norris, sailed from hence the 9th Instant to the Bay of King, and joined the Danish Squadron consisting of 12 Men of War, commanded by Admiral Raab, who has fince fent out a Frigate towards Bornholm, to get Intelligence of the Motions of the Swedish Fleet. The King of Denmark is at present at Odensee, attended by his Great Marshal Count Callemberg, and M. Gabel his Secretary at War, but the rest of his Ministers continue here. the Danish Men of War which sailed some Time ago to the North Sea, are returned into our Road, the other three being found

iumicient to prevent any Attempt by Sea of the Swedes on that Side.

Hague, June 21. The States of Holland and West-Friseland adjourned the 18th Instant till the 24th, by which Time it is expected the several Cities of this Province will have sent up their Consent to this Republick's Entring note the Treaty for preserving the General Peace and Tranquillity of Christendom. The Office of Great Master or Surveyor. Letters which came in Yelterday from Vienna give an Account, that the Turkish Plenipotentiaries at Passarowitz having receiv'd from the Sultan New Full Powers in such Form as proved entirely to the Satisfaction of all Parties, the Conferences were opened the 5th Instant, in which the main Point, That each Side should keep what they are now posfels'd of, was agreed to, and so great a Progress was made towards feetling the other Articles, that there is no Room to doubt of that Negotiation's being foon brought to a happy Conclusion.
