N Humble Address of the Grand Jury of Barbados, was presented to His Majefty by the Agents of the laid Island, introduced by the Right Honourable Mr. Secretary Craggs.

An Addreis of the Prefident and other principal Inhabitants of the Ifland of St. Christopher, has likewife been prefented to His Majesty by Collonel Matthews, Lieutenant General of the Leeward Iflands, and Lieutenant Governour of the faid Ifland of St. Christopher, introduced by the Right Honourable Mr. Secretary Craggs.

Which Addreffes His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Algiers, March 29. On the 9th of this Month Ali Bashaw, our Dey, fell ill of a Fever, of which he died the 25th in the Evening, having governed this State feven Years and feven Months, and concluded his Administration with this peculiar Felicity, that he left it in Peace, and died a natu-ral Death, in that Station, which has never happened but to one of his Predeceffors. The 26th, early in the Morning, a Divan was held, in which Mohamet, who was Treasurer to the deceased Dey, was elected his Succeffor, and immediately took Possession of his Of-fice. About an Hour after Mr. Thompson, the British Conful, went to Congratulate him upon his Advancement to the Government, and required him to confirm the Articles of Peace between His Majesty of Great Britain and this State; the Dey received him with Marks of great Respect to His Majesty, and of Kindnels and Civility towards His Minifter, and readily confented to what the Conful defired, which he has fince performed by executing a Confirmation in Form of the faid Treaty, accompanying it with Promiles of ufing his best Endeavours to cultivate Peace and a good Correspondence with the British Nation.

Belgrade, May 31. A confiderable Number of Cannon has lately been brought hither by Water from Buda and other Places, to be planted upon the new Fortifications lately added to this Town, which by the great Care and Diligence of Count Odwyer, who has had the chief Direction of thole Works, and of the Repairs of the old ones, is put into a far better State of Defence than while it was in the Pofferfion of the Turks. The Train of Artillery for the Service of our Army is likewife arrived at Semlin, near which Place the Troops come in daily, and in very few Days the whole Army will be encamped. Count Mercy is drawing together another Body of Imperial Troops upon the Banks of the Danube, at fome Diffance below this Place. A Bridge is making on the Danube near Semendria, after the finifhing of which, three other Bridges will be built

on that River at proper Diffances, and great Numbers of Pioneers and Country People are employed in clearing the Ways about our Camp, as well for the Conveniency of bringing Provifions and other Neceffaries to it, as for the Eafe of the Troops whenever they shall have Occafion to march. In the mean Time the Minifters of the feveral Powers who are employed to negociate a Treaty of Peace between the Emperour, the Venetians, and the Ottoman Porte, are settling their Quarters at Passarowitz; but there is a Complaint of Scarcity of Provisions, especially in the Quarter of the Turkish Ambassadours, who have desired the Imperialists that they may be fupplied for their Money from our Side of the Country, which was readily granted, and Pal-fes are given them for that Purpole. A Turkish Aga who came lately with some Difpatches from Adrianople to the Ministers of the Porte at the Congress, returning home through our Quarters, Care was taken to fhew him the good Condition of our Troops, and the Forwardness they are in towards taking the Field, that he might be able to undeceive the Sultan, whom, as it was reported, Count Ragotski had endeavoured to perfuade that the Defigns of the Spaniards on the Emperour's Territories in Italy would caufe fuch a Diversion of his Forces as to oblige him to weaken his Army in Hungary to a confiderable Degree. The Turks are drawing together some Troops near Niffa, but are fo backward in their Preparations that their Army cannot be formed fooner than the End of next Month.

Buda, June 4. Prince Eugene of Savoy arrived here the 2d Inftant by Water from Vienna; he was received at the Water fide by Baron Loffenholz our Governour, and faluted by a treble Difcharge of our Cannon. His Highnefs, without making any Stay, purfued his Voyage towards Belgrade, in order to take upon him the Command of the Imperial Army. Supplies of Men, Artillery and Warlike Stores are daily paffing by this Place for the Army, the greateft Part of which is al₇ ready arrived at the general Renderwows in the Plains of Semlin; and all Accounts agree, that never were feen Regiments more compleat and better appointed.

compleat and better appointed. Copenhagen, June 11. The Britifh Squadron under the Command of Admiral Norris, failed from hence the 9th Inftant to the Bay of Kiog, and joined the Danifh Squadron confifting of 12 Men of War, commanded by Admiral Raab, who has fince fent out a Frigate towards Bornholm, to get Intelligence of the Motions of the Swedifh Fleet. The King of Denmark is at prefent at Odensee, attended by his Great Marshal Count Callemberg, and M. Gabel his Secretary at War, but the reft of his Ministers continue here. Two of the Danish Men of War which failed fome Time ago to the North Sea, are returned into our Road, the other three being found fufficients
