THE M5 MOTORWAY (AVONMOUTH BRIDGE, SEPARATE TRACK AND FOOTWAY) (15 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 200

The Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 84(1)(a), and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9, to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the separate track and footway across the M5 Avonmouth Bridgein the city of Bristol and in the district of North Somerset.

The effect of the Order would be to impose a 15 mph speed limit on all motor vehicles using the track/footway, adjacent to the southbound carriageway of the M5 from its junction with the B4054 Avonmouth Road south-westwards for a distance of 1,783 metres.

The existing temporary speed limit Order will be revoked. THE CAMDEN (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO 79) TRAFFIC ORDER 2001

REDINGTON/FROGNAL CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Camden, on 14 March 2002, made the above-mentioned Orders, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49, 51 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991, the details of which as modified following consultation, were previously published in *The London Gazette* on 19 October 2001, under Ref 504.

The general nature and effect of the Camden (Parking Places) (CA-S) Order will be to introduce Controlled Parking Zone restrictions into the streets mentioned in annex 1 to this notice, to include provision for types of bays indicated below:

Schedule 1: Resident/Business/Residents' Visitor-designated Parking Places (12.30 pm to 2.30 pm, Monday to

Schedule 2: Resident/Business/Residents' Visitor and Pay and

Display, (Shared-use) (12.30 pm to 2.30 pm, Monday

to Friday)

Schedule 3: Resident/Business/Residents' Visitor—designated Parking Places (9.00 am to 6.00 pm, Monday to

Saturday)

Schedule 4: Resident/Business/Residents'

Visitor—designated Parking Places (12.30 pm to 2.30 pm, Monday to

Friday)—Buffer zone,

Schedule 5: Resident/Business/Residents' Visitor-designated parking places (9.00 am to 6.00 pm, Monday to Saturday)—Buffer zone,

Resident/Business/Residents' Visitor and Pay and Schedule 6: Display, (Shared-use) (maximum stay 2 hours) (9.00

am to 6.00 pm, Monday to Saturday),

Vehicles for which parking places are designated are passenger vehicles, goods vehicles (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.32 metres or width does not exceed 2.2 metres), motorcycles or invalid carriages. Residents displaying a valid permit on their vehicle will be able to park in any of the specified Resident/Residents' Visitor/Business permit bays in Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4, ,5 and 6, during the permitted hours. The cost of a residents' parking permit, valid from the date of issue, will

be either:

- (a) £10.00 for a resident's permit valid for one month;
- (b) £25.00 for a resident's permit valid for three months;
- (c) £45.00 for a resident's permit valid for six months;
- (d) £82.00 for a resident's permit valid for one year.

An additional resident's permit for a motorcycle can be obtained per each applicant at half price of the above tariffs.

Vehicles displaying a valid disabled person's "orange or/european blue badge" can park without time limit and will be exempt from parking charges in designated bays. On yellow lines such vehicles may park for a maximum period of three hours, except at locations and at such times as loading restrictions are in operation.

Additionally vehicles eligible for and displaying either a valid resident or business permit with the suffix (/W) on their vehicle will be able to park in any of the specified parking places in the proposed Buffer zone designated in a part of the Controlled Parking Zone, during the permitted hours.

The Order also provides that all adult residents, some businesses and medical practitioners, (ie doctors, surgeons and dentists) may purchase
