N humble Addrefs of the Lieutenant Governour, Council and Affembly of the Ifland, of Antigua met at the Town of St. John's, having been transmitted hither, has been prefented to His Majefty by their Agent, being introduced by the Right Honourable James Craggs, Elq; one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Prefident and Council, and of the Affembly of the Island of Nevis, affembled at Charles Town in the faid Island on the 12th of March 1aft, having been transmitted bither, has been prefented to His Majesty by Collonel Daniel Smith their Lieutenant-Governour, and Jofeph Jory, Esq; their Agent, being introduced by the Right Honourable James Craggs, Esq; one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Venice, June 17. Several Merchant-Ships of different Nations which are come in from the Lovant, have brought Advice, that the greatest Part of the Veteran Troops which were garriloned in the Morea, were gone from thence for Hungary, fo that the Gar-rilons were become very weak, except those of Napoli di Romania, Modon, and fome others. Letters from Corfu of the 21st of last Month tell us, that the Venetian Fleet was not yet failed from thence; that according to the fresheft Advices the Turkish Fleet was at the Dardanels, but that a Squadron had been detached for Alexandria, there to take on board 5000 Turks of the Ægyptian Troops and transport them to Theffalonica, whence they are to proceed to Hungary. Four of the Pope's Gallies and two of the Duke of Tuscany's are arrived at Otranto, and wait there to be joined by the Maltese Squadron. On the 13th Instant 38 Transports sailed from hence for Corfu, with Recruits for the Grison and Italian Regiments, and with large Stores of Provisions. By a Veffel which is arrived from Dalmatia, we have an Account, that the Proveditore General Mocenigo was at Sebenico on the 2d Inftant, and was to go the next Day to Spalatro, to give Or-ders for the March of 3000 Men which were to be imbarked for some Enterprize that was kept fecret.

Madrid, June 20. 'Tis advifed from Balfain, that the King of Spain is pretty well recovered, not having had any Fits of Ague for feveral Days paft ; and that he intends to remove on the 25th Inftant to the Efcurial, for fome Weeks. By Letters from Barcelona of the 12th Inftant we learn, that on the 8th the Horfe and Dragoons were begun to be imbark-

ed, and on the 12th were most of them on board, the Infantry still lying in Quarters in the Neighbourhood, in order to imbark lass 3 and that it was believed the Fleet would be ready to put to Sea on the 16th or 17th. The Squadron which failed from Cadiz the 26th of lass Month to reinforce the Fleet at Barcelona, has been detained by contrary Winds on the Coast of Alicant.

Genoa, June 21. Two Maltele Ships of War which arrived here from Barcelona three Days ago, bring Advice, that about the 7th Inftant the Intendant Sig: Patino received Advice by an Express from the Court of Madrid, that the Squadron from Cadiz, defigned for Barcelona, had put to Sea; whereupon he immediately gave Directions for imbarking the Forces at Barcelona. We have fince received Advice, by the Way of Leghorn, that on the 30th paft the Cadiz Squadron was forced by Stress of Weather to put into Cartagena. We have Letters from Cagliari in Sardinia of the 12th Inftant, which fay a confiderable Number of Transports was arrived there, to takewon board 12 Battallions and 14 Squadrons; and that 'tis not defigned the Spanish Fleet shall touch at Sardinia.

touch at Sardinia. Hague, July 1. In order to adjust the Boints of the Barrier-Treaty which are yet in dif-pute, his Excellency the Earl of Cadoganal-fisted with the Deputies of the Council of State on the 29th past, at the Examination of the Accompts concerning the Sums negotiated in the Netherlands, under the Administration of the Maritime Potentates ; in which a confiderable Progress has been made, and that whole Affair will be finished in a few Days. The Marquels de Prié having desired that Baron Heems should likewise be prefent at the fettling the faid Accompts, the States General have readily agreed to it; and he will affift in the next Conference, which is to be held on the 4th Inftant. M. Dalwig, Minister here from the Landgrave of Heffe-Caffel, has received Orders from his Master to go to the Court of Great Britain, and defigns to fet out for England on the 5th Infant. This Morning the States of the Province of Holland were re-affembled. The Marquess Beretti Landi, the Spanish Ambasfadour, had used all Methods to diffwade, and even to deter them by repeated Threats of confilcating all the Effects in Spain be-longing to the Dutch, from entring into the Treaty of Alliance for the Prefervation of the general Peace and Tranquility of Europe. Notwithstanding which they agreed unanimoufly in a Refolution to fign that Treaty : Which Refolution is to be delivered to Morrow or on Monday next to the Affembly of the States General; where the Deputies of most of the Provinces are ready to confent to this Republick's joining in the faid Al-

And whereas on Sasurday the 21 ft Instant they came again into the faid Park, and set fire to the Lodge, standing about it till it was burnt down to the Ground, after which they gave SVolley and Huzza, declaring aloud they would do further Mischief by setting Fire to the Castle, and that they pould leave no living Greature about the Park. His Ma-Jefty is pleafed to promife His most Gracious Pardon to any one of the Perfons concerned in the faid Riot, who Iball difcover any Two or more of his Accomplices, fo as they may be apprehended and convicted.
