Letters from Copénhagen of the 5th Instant advise, that Sir John Norris with the British Squadron was then lying off Stevens-Point in the Bay of Koge; and would keep that Station till the Arrival of the Dutch Squadron. Four Danish Men of War and two Frigates, were ordered to cruize off Sand-Hammer and near Bornholm, to get Intelligence of the Swedes, who had fome Cruizers in those Parts. The King of Denmark is at Classholm, a Seat which his Majesty bought lately in Jutland.

Dresden, July 6. On the 3d Instant M. Manteuffel set out from hence for Berlin, to confer with the King of Pruffia's Ministers.
