Madrid, August 1.

HE Queen of Spain was taken ill last Week of a Feverish Distemper, but is now faid to be in a fair way of Re-Upon our Court's receiving the News of the Spanish Forces having made a Descent in Sicily, and possest themseves of Palermo, the Count de Lascarie, the King of Sicily's Minister, was sent for to the Escurial, where he had a Conference with the King of Spain's Ministers, who informed him of the Reasons which induced his Majesty to this Proceeding, that he might acquaint his Master therewith; then he was directed to return hither, and not to leave this Place till further Notice; and Orders were given to the Guards of our Gates to observe narrowly all Persons going out of Town, and not to suffer the Sicilian Minister to pass out of the City. The 27th past at Night, Collonel Stanhope, Envoy Éxtraordinary from the King of Great Britain, and the Marquis de Nancré, the most Christian King's Minister, received an Express from Pasis, upon which they went together to the Escurial, and returned hither the 30th. By this Express we had Advice, that a Convention between their Britannick and most Christian Majesties for settling the Terms of Treaties between the Emperour and the Kings of Spain and Sicily, in order to restore the Tranquillity of Europe, had been signed at Paris by the Earl Stanhope and the Earl of Stairs on the Part of Great Britain, and the Marshal d'Huxelles and the Count de Chiverny on the Part of France; and that the Earl Stanhope intended to let out from thence the 22d for the Court The Royal Council of Castille met the 30th, to consider of several Points referred to them by the King's Order, concerning the Measures to be taken in the present Conjun-Eture, with regard to the Court of Rome. Up. on the Arong Representations that have been made in behalf of the Merchants concerned in the Cargo of Bullion and Pieces of Eight imported by the Advice Ship which lately arrived at Cadiz from the West Indies, of the Injustice of confiscating the same to the King's Use, this Court has been prevailed with to revoke that Order, and they are only to pay an Indulto or Tax of 10 per Cent. to his Majesty. The Earl of Effex left this Place the 26th, inten-

ding to return to England by the way of France. They write from Barcelona, that the Officer who had been dispatched to our Court by Admiral Byng, arrived there from hence the 23d, and would embark the next Day, in order to return on Board the British Fleet: And that two Men of War, one of 74 and the other of 64 Guns, which have been bought at Genoa for the King of Spain's Service, were come from thence into that Port.

Berne, Aug. 3. The Abbot de St. Gall having notified to this Canton, that he had figured the Treaty of Peace and Amity lately concluded at Baden by his Deputies with those of this Canton and of Zurich, and that his Ratifications of it in Form should forthwith be fent hither to be exchanged with those of the said Cantons: Our Sovereign Council were extraordinarily affembled last Week, to consult upon the Method of put-ting the Abbot in Possession of the Territories that were taken from his Predeceffor during the late Disturbances, and which are to be restored to him by this Treaty. This Matter was referred to a Committee, who made their Report to the Council the 1st Instant, pursuant to which it has been re-solved, that upon the Exchange of the Ra-tifications, all the Lands and Revenues that belonged to his Abby, and which are in the Hands of these Cantons, shall immediately be delivered up to him, and the Inhabitants shall be directed to take the usual Oaths of Fidelity to him and his Successors, he promifing to maintain them in the Enjoyment of their Rights and Privileges pursuant to the Treaty abovementioned. The Council has further determined to yield to him the entire Profit of this Year's Harvest, and some part of that of last Year, and has written to the Canton of Zurich to communicate this Resolution to them, and desire their Concurrence. The Dyet of Frauenfeldt is broke up, and the Deputies of the Cantons of Zurich, Bern and Glaris, are returned to Baden to settle some Accounts depending among themselves.

Copenhagen, Aug. 6. The King of Denmark came the 2d Instant from Coldingen to Fredericksbourg, and Yesterday his Majesty returned to this Place. The British and Danish Fleet continues at Bornholm to observe the Swedes, who have not yet made any Motion

either at Sea or Land. We do not hear of the Return of Baron de Gortz, the King of Sweden's Minister to the Isle of Aland to renew the Conferences with the Czar's Ministers, and that Negociation is generally looked upon upon to be at an End-

Dresdon, Aug. 6. The King of Poland intends towards the end of this Month to set out for Grodno, where a General Diet of the Kingdom of Poland is appointed to meet. Letters from Warsaw of the 25th say, a Body of Muscovite Forces was come to Pultowsk, within seven Miles of that City, and that it was reported the Czar had new Demands to make of the Kingdom and Republick of Poland.

Brussels, Aug. 10. General Vrangel has received from Prince Eugene of Savoy, Governour General of these Provinces, a Commission to be Governour of this City, and has accordingly taken Possession of this Government. Letters from Vienna say, that Orders were given for the sending hither six Imperial Regiments from Hungary. The Count de Boschart has received a Commission to raise a Regiment of Horse. The Sieur Nanny, one of the Commissioners appointed to confer with those of the States upon several Points relating to the Execution of the Barrier Treaty, is come hither to confer with the Marquis de Prié, who it is said intends to go himself to the Hague in a few Days.

Pari, Aug. 13. Baron Schleinitz, Envoy from the Czar of Muscovy, has lately had an Audience of the Regent to notify the Death of the Czarowitz, and the several Circumstances which preceded it with Relation to his being found guilty of a Conspiracy against his Father. The Duties upon Tobacco imported into this Kingdom for 25 Years to come, have, by a Grant from the King to our new West India Company, been appropriated to the Payment of the Interest of their Stock; and they have appointed four Directors for the Management of that Revenue, to each of whom they allow a Salaro of 15000 Livres a Year.
