Genoa, Aug. 6. The Burford Man of War, Captain Vanbrugh Commander, arrived here the 30th past from Port Mahon, having left the British Fleet commanded by Sir George Byng under Sail, being bound from thence to Naples; the Captain fent on Shoar a Packet for the Governour of Milan, which was immediately forwarded by an Express, and the first Instant this Ship par to Sea again in order to rejoin the Fleet. That Day two French Veffels came in here laden with Corn: Three Feluccas arrived likewife in our Port from Meffina, one of which had on board the Lady of the Governour of that Place,and her Retinue. They give an Account, that the Garrison was very well provided with all Necessaries, and was resolved to defend it felf to the last Extremity.

Madrid, Aug. 8. The Queen of Spain being recovered of a Fever, which had confined her to her Apartment, has gone abroad these two Days to take the Air. The 2d Inftant an Express arrived at the Ecurial with Letters from Palermo of the 14th of the last Month, giving an Account, that the Garrison of the Caftle A Mare adjoining to that City, which notwithstanding its Weakness, and the bad Condition of the Fortifications, held out ten Days, surrendered that Morning, after the Besiegers had made two Breaches, both paffable. . The faid Garrison infifted upon being allowed to march out with the usual Marks of Honour, but the Marquis de Lede would allow them no other Terms, than that they should surrender at Discretion, and become Priloners of War, which they were obliged to fubmit to; and Orders were given for transporting them, part to Barcelona, and the reft to Alicant. These Letters add, that a Number of the

The Earl Stanhope is daily expected here from Bayonne, whicher a Pals was fent him eight Days ago from his Catholick Majesty. The Council of the Hazien da, or Treasury, was extraordinarily af-fembled the 5th of this Month, and was made acquainted, that the King has appointed one and twenty Surveyors, and as many Accountants, for the collecting of his Revenues in the feveral Provinces of his Dominions, not excepting Navarr, Biscay, Guipuscoa and Alava, which will prove a great Mortification to the Inhabitants of the Countries abovenamed, who have hitherto enjoyed the Privilege of raifing the publick Money within their Limits, by Officers of their own chufing. These Surveyors and Accountants are ordered to repair to the respective Diffricts allotted them, before the first of September, and are faid to be charged with very voluminous Instruc-tions containing several Articles calculated for the Improvement of the Revel-nue. The Refolutions of the Council of Caffille, with regard to the Diffe-rences between this Court and that of Rome, are not yet made publick. Or-ders are fent to the Council of the Indies to take Gare; that for the future four Advice-Boats be regularly difpatched every Year to Peru, one in January, another in March, the third in June, and the fourth in November, to the end we may

get better Intelligence than we have hi-therto had, of what passes in those Parts. Berne, Aug. 19. This State being informed that the new coined French Crowns are made current in France much above their intrinick Value, bas issued out a Proclamation, strictly prohibiting throughout this Canton the receiving of that Coin, on the Penalty of Confication. Bruffels, Aug. 15: The Convention lately made between the Emperour, the most Chriftian King, and the States General, against entertaining Deserters from each other's Troops, having been approved and ratified by the several Parties concerned, ing to His Mojesty's Guards, do Suttle and keep publick was read this Week at the Head of our Garrison, which had been drawn out for that Purpole. For the better preventing fuch Tumults as that which lately happened here, the Night-Watch has been augmented, and they have Orders given them to fire upon any Perfon they find making a Disturbance ; Directions are allo given for repairing forthwith the Fortifications of the Caftle of Monterey that commands part of the Town. and for providing it with Ammunition, which will contribute to keep the Rabble in awe. The Sieur Nenny, who lately came to receive the Marquis de Prié's Instructions upon fome Points relating to the Execution of the Barrier Trea-ty, and the fettling of the Arrears depending, between the Emperor and the States General, for what their High Mightineffes furnished during the War for the Defence of the Netherlands, is gone back to the Hague to carry on that Negotiation.

Paris, Aug. 20. The Abbot du Bois, Ambassadour Extraordinary from his most Christian Majesty to the King of Great Britain, returned hither this Week from London, and waited upon the Regent to give him an Account of his Negoriation, by whom he was received with particular Marks of Efteem, and of the Approbation due to his great Services. His Royal Highness has been ill of an Inflammation in his Eyes, but is perfectly recovered. Our Troops began this Day to march, in order to change their Quarters, which they usually do once a Year, and the Prince of Conti's Regiment of Horse being to pass by the Village of St. Denis near this City, the Regent intends in Person to review them. The Duke de Mombazon, Son to the Prince of Guimené, has lately marryed a Daughter of the Prince of Rohan. Our fresheft Advices from Italy give an Account, that the British Fleet under the Command of Sir George Byng, arrived at Baia near Naples the 2d Inftant, N.S. They write from Rome that the Count de Charolois was on his Departure from Thence for the Elector of Bavaria's Court. Letters from Spain fay, a very firict Ot-der had been published to forbid the carrying of Horfes and Mules out of that Kingdom. They add that their Trade was very much diffurbed by Numbers of Privateers bearing the Emperour's Colours, who were come on their Coafts from Newport and Oftend, and had taken several Spanish Merchant Ships.
