THE OFFSHORE PETROLEUM PRODUCTION AND PIPE-LINES (ASSESSMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS) REGULATIONS 1999

PUBLICATION OF DECISIONS

BRITISH PHARMACOPOEIA (VETERINARY) 2002

The Agriculture Ministers, that is to say in respect of England, Scotland and Wales the Secretary of State concerned with the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and in respect of Northern Ireland the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development that exercises the powers of the Department's Ministers during the suspension of devolved government in Northern Ireland, acting jointly, having on the recommendation of the Medicines Commission caused to be published the *British Pharmacopoeia (Veterinary) 2002*, hereby gives notice in accordance with section 102(5) of the Medicines Act 1968 that the subject matter contained in the *British Pharmacopoeia (Veterinary) 2002* shall take effect on 1 December 2002 except that where a different effective date is indicated in the text in respect of any part of that subject matter, that different date, notice of which has already been given in accordance with section 102(5), shall be the date for that part of the subject matter to take effect. For the purposes of section 102(6) of the Medicines Act 1968, the printer to Her Majesty of all Acts of Parliament has been authorised by the said Ministers to print copies of the subject matter contained in the *British Pharmacopoeia (Veterinary) 2002*. MEDICINES ACT 1968

EUROPEAN PHARMACOPOEIA: APPROVED SYNONYMS

The Health Ministers, that is to say in respect of England, Scotland and Wales, the Secretary of State concerned with health in England and in respect of Northern Ireland the Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety that exercises the powers of the Department's Ministers during the suspension of devolved Government in Northern Ireland, acting jointly, hereby declare under section 65(8) of the Medicines Act 1968 that the Medicines Commission has approved a list of synonyms for names at the head of monographs in the European Pharmacopoeia. The subject matter of the list shall take effect on 1 December 2002 and all previous lists of approved synonyms are hereby withdrawn.

A copy of the said list is included in Appendix XXI B (Approved Synonyms) of the *British Pharmacopoeia 2002*. (1013)
