

out from Passarowitz on the 24th, in order to return to Constantinople, there to reside as Ambassadour from their High Mightinesses, M. Fleischman has brought hither the Treaty of Commerce with the Turks ratified. We have Advice, that the Barons Petrasch and Stein, who were made Prisoners by the Turks and confined in the Seven Towers at Constantinople, having been set at Liberty by Virtue of the Treaty, arrived the 26th of last Month at Hermandstadt; and that the next Day Prince Nicholas Mauro-Cordato, Hospodar of Walachia, was set at Liberty, and went from thence with a Guard of 40 Grenadiers: Count Steinvile, Governour of Transilvania, made a Present to that Prince at his Departure of six fine Horses. 'Tis reported, that Prince Eugene of Savoy, being well recovered of his late Indisposition, will shortly set out for the Austrian Netherlands.

Brussels, Sept. 22. Last Night the Prince de la Tour received Advice by an Express from Vienna, that on the 14th Instant the Empress was brought to Bed of an Archduchess.

Hague, Sept. 23. The States of the Province of Holland are to re-assemble next Week, by which Time 'tis believed the rest of the Provinces will be ready to enter into the Quadruple Alliance. This Morning the Marquess de Chateaufeuf set out on his Return to Paris. General Palmes, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Poland, arrived here on the 15th, and on the 17th set out for Dresden. On the 15th the Prince of Portugal left this Place, and after he has seen some Towns of Holland, will proceed through the Austrian Netherlands to France.

Hampton-Court, Sept. 5, 1718.
