Hague, Sept. 23. The States of the Province of Holland are to re-affemble next Week, by which Time 'tis believed the rest of the Provinces will be teady to enter into the Quadruple Assiance. This Morning the Marquess de Chatéausteus set out on his Return to Paris. General Palmes, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Poland, arrived here on the 15th, and on the 17th set out for Dresden. On the 15th the Prince of Portugal lest this Place, and after he has seen some Towns of Holland, will proceed through the Austrian Netherlands to France,
