THE HAVERING (PRESCRIBED ROUTE) (NO) TRAFFIC ORDER 200

1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Havering, hereinafter called the Council, proposes to amend the original proposals, advertised on 26 April 2002, to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The original proposal was to the effect that the Order would be to prohibit all vehicles having a maximum gross weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes from proceeding in Gaynes Park Road, Harwood Hall Lane, Little Gaynes Lane, Parkland Avenue, Tawney Avenue or The Approach.

3. Having considered all representations from the original consultation, the Council propose to extend the prohibition to Alder Avenue, Boundary Road and Bridge Avenue.

4. The prohibition mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3 would not apply: (i) to a bus; or

(ii) to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority whilst undertaking a statutory power or duty in a prescribed street; or

(iii) in relation to a vehicle being used in connection with the removal of any obstruction in a prescribed street; or

(iv) to a goods vehicle delivering to or collecting goods from premises in a prescribed street; or

(v) in relation to a vehicle being used in connection with the cleansing of gullies in a prescribed street, or being used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in a prescribed street, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway in a prescribed street, the laying, erection, alteration or repair in a prescribed street of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunication system, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to proceed in the prescribed street; or

(vi) in relation to any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or

(vii) to anything done with the permission or the direction of a police constable in uniform; or

(viii) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

5. A copy of the new proposed Order, together with the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order and a plan showing the locations and effects of the Order can be inspected until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made or as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Order, during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at the Building and Technical Services Reception, Whitworth Centre, Noak Hill Road, Harold Hill, Romford, Essex RM3 7YA.

6. Any person desiring to object to the proposed extension of the prohibition to these additional roads or make other representation should send a statement in writing of either their objection or representations and the grounds thereof to the Councils' agents, TMO Services, 4 Snell Gardens, Herne Bay, Kent CT6 7SU, quoting Ref LBH/ 243A to arrive by 3 January 2003.
