THE BARNET (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (SPECIAL PARKING AREA) (1997, NO 53) (EXPERIMENTAL **AMENDMENT NO 49) TRAFFIC ÓRDER 2002**

- 1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet have made on 18 December 2002, the above-mentioned Orders under sections 9 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2. The general nature and effect of the Orders will be to:

introduce new waiting restrictions at the junction of Finchley Lane with Alexandra Road and the junction of Alexandra Road with Victoria Road. These restrictions will operate At any time.

introduce a one way traffic flow in Albert Road, Alexandra Road and Hill View Gardens, NW4 on the following lengths of road:

- (a) In Albert Road from its junction with Bell Lane for its entire length, all traffic must travel in a northerly and westerly direction.
- (b) In Alexandra Road from its junction with Victoria Road to its junction with Bell Lane, all traffic must travel in a southerly direction. (c) In Alexandra Road from its junction with Victoria Road to its junction with Finchley Lane, all traffic must travel in a northerly direction.
- (d) In Hillview Gardens from its junction with Finchley Lane to its junction with Boyne Avenue, all traffic must travel in a southerly and south-easterly direction.
- 3. The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply in relation to anything done:
- (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in
- (b) in accordance with traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
- (c) by any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency.
- 4. The Orders provide that, in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Chief Executive of the Council or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, if it appears to him essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Orders runs, modify or suspend the operation of the Orders or any provision thereof.

- 5. A copy of the Orders, which will come into operation on Monday 23 December 2002, a plan of the scheme, the Council's statement of reasons for making the Orders and for proceeding by way of experiment and whether the Council intend to consider making a permanent Order in like terms, can be inspected on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, between 9.00 am and 5.00 pm (Bank Holidays excepted) for a period of 6 months from that date at:
