B. THE LONDON BOROUGH OF HOUNSLOW (PARKING PLACES) (NO 4, 2000) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2002

- 1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hounslow on 16 December 2002 made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.
- 2. The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Amendment Order will be further to amend the Hounslow (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977 so that-

- (b) waiting by vehicles for the purposes of the delivering or collecting of goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes will be prohibited between 11.00 am and 6.30 pm on Mondays to Saturdays in the streets or parts of streets referred to in sub-paragraph
- (c) a "free" solo motor cycle parking place will be designated in the north-eastern arm of Linden Gardens, Chiswick.
- 3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable or Council appointed Parking Attendant in uniform or in certain circumstances, eg, the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol etc from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" or "Blue Badge" will apply.

- Hounslow (Parking Places) (No 4) Order 2000, which imposes the North Feltham Trading Estate Parking Scheme, by reducing the number of parking spaces in the parking place on the north-east side of River Gardens adjacent to No 4 River Gardens.
