THE A646 TRUNK ROAD (BURNLEY ROAD, TODMORDEN) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER

The Secretary of State for Transport gives notice that he intends to make an Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) of Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order if made as proposed will prohibit vehicles, from waiting at any time on any day, on the north-eastern side of the A646 Trunk Road (Burnley Road) Todmorden, in the District of Calderdale, from a point 30.6 metres west of the centreline of Ferney Lee Road to a point 16.6 metres west of Ferney Lee Road.

Exceptions to the waiting prohibition have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to be used:

in connection with any building operation or demolition;

for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the trunk road or services therein:

for emergency purposes by the police, fire brigade or ambulance services;

for anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden;

by a local authority or water company in pursuance of their respective statutory powers or duties,

or, when the person in control of the vehicle is required to stop

in order to avoid an accident:

due to circumstances outside the person's control.
