- (e) to introduce double yellow line waiting restrictions in those lengths of The Croft specified in the Schedule to this notice and single yellow line waiting restrictions operating during the controlled hours specified in paragraph 2(b) above in the remaining lengths of The Croft.
- 3. Residents Parking Permits will be available at a cost of £25 per annum.
- 4. Business Visitors Vouchers can be purchased at a cost of £1 per hour and Residents Visitors Vouchers can be purchased at a cost of 40p for a period of up to 3 hours to a maximum of £1.00 for all day. Borough wide vouchers will be available to park in the zone for £1 per hour.
